Dale is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Monroe Pruitt, P. O. 10, Box 252-B. He has been a farmer in the family since he was born, and a farmer in fact since he was 9. He won the trip for being one of the three best 4-H Club judges of dairy cattle in the State. The other two will make the trip with him.
