

ATTICA EDITOR BACKS WILLIS TO TOP MINTON

M'Dermond in Washington, Declares Indiana Will Go G. O. P. in 1940.

WICHITA, Oct. 12.—J. Frank McDermont Jr., Attica editor and publisher, declared today that Senator Sherman Minton (D. Ind.) will be defeated next year by Raymond E. Willis, Angola editor and publisher, whom the Republicans are expected to nominate.

He also asserted that Indiana will go Republican, but admitted that if Paul V. McNutt obtains the Democratic Presidential nomination, it will be a great handicap to the Hoosier G. O. P.

Visits With F. D. R.

Long prominent in Republican politics, Mr. McDermont was the Attica postmaster under President Hoover. But he didn't attend the postmasters' convention here. He lost the postoffice job to a Democrat.

He did, however, attend a White House dinner, and lingered behind to see President Roosevelt. He also greeted such old-time friends, as Col. Edmund W. Starling, White House Secret Service chief, and Patrick McKenna, the veteran greeter of White House visitors.

Among the newspapermen whom Mr. McDermont visited was his long-time friend, Mark Sullivan. He informed the latter that in addition to operating the Attica Ledger-Tribune, a Republican daily, he also publishes the Fountain-Warren Democrat, a weekly.

Early Success, He Says

"I do not believe the Democrats can win in Indiana in 1940 unless there is a vast switch from the present to the G. O. P.," he said.

"The new G. O. P. elephant seemed pretty dead for a time, but came to life last year and is alive and kicking plenty right now. That Indianapolis rally, staged by the editors and the state committee, was one of the most successful in the history of the party."

LAKE PLACID, N. Y., Oct. 12.—Without the earth's atmosphere to scatter sunlight, there would be no blue sky and the golden hues of sunset.

Color of skylight outside the earth's belt of air have the appearance of a dull, completely overcast sky. Dr. K. S. Gibson of the National Bureau of Standards told the Optical Society of America here today in reporting on the spectral energy distribution of skylight.

Light filtering through overcast has virtually the same distribution of its colors as does skylight outside the earth's belt. The slight lack of red rays which are absorbed by the water vapor in the overcast.

GROSS TAX DEADLINE NEAR, STATE WARNS

The deadline for payment of quarterly gross income taxes on incomes of \$1000 or more for the preceding event is midnight Sunday, Gilbert Hewitt, acting director of the State Gross Income Tax Division, warned today.

Delinquent returns are subject to a penalty of 10 per cent of the tax and interest at the rate of 1 per cent a month.

Mr. Hewitt added that the taxation of Federal salaries is retroactive to Jan. 1, 1939, and that all Federal employees who designated Indiana as their home at the time of their employment will be subject to the gross income tax regardless of where they are stationed.
