War Spreads To Jelly Bread

BERLIN, Oct. 12 (U. P.).—Only six varieties of jams and jellies will be manufactured in Germany hereafter, it was announced today. The standardized varieties will be four-fruit marmalade, mixed marmalade, two-fruit marmalade, second press apple jelly, chopped apple and chopped beet. Jams and jellies, no longer sold in jars, will be distributed to shops in pails, to be sold in amounts indicated on ratio cards.

JOB GAIN CUTS INSURANCE COST

Compensation Payments in City Drop \$30,000 Within Month.

The gain in employment throughout Indiana last month caused job insurance payments to decrease nearly \$400,000, Wilfred Jessup, director of the State Unemployment Compensation Division, reported today.

Only \$540,000 in benefits were paid during September as compared with \$948,777 in August. In September, a year ago, total payments of \$2,701,621 were made, Mr. Jessup said. The increased employment also was reflected in the Indianapolis district, with September payments amounting to \$90,831, approximately \$30,000 less than the month before.

The only cities in the State showing larger job insurance payments were La Porte, Michigan City, South Bend and Jasper, Mr. Jessup said.

'HAM-AND-EGG' PENSION GIVEN EVEN CHANCE

California to Vote on Plan For Second Time In Year.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 12.—For the second time in a year California will vote Nov. 7 on an initiative amendment to the State constitution which seeks to assure every individual more than 50 years of age and unemployed or retired an income of not less than \$30 a week.

This proposition—the \$30-Every-Thursdays or "Ham-and-Eggs" pension plan—has made so many converts that it is given almost an even chance at the polls.

President Roosevelt, however, has opposed openly this plan and the Ohio proposal to give \$50 a month to everyone over 60.

When submitted to the people last November the California proposal called for weekly issuance of 40 certificates, each of \$1 denomination, to all retired persons of 50 or over. It sought to repeal the State's 3 per cent sales tax and required all teachers and state, county, city and other public employees to accept half their salaries in cash and half in the so-called warrants.

All taxes and other public obligations also could be paid with the warrants.

Stamps Provided for

The warrants would have had no cash value. Merchants and others accepting them would have been required to affix a two-cent stamp to each warrant in their possession on Thursday of any week. By the end of a year every warrant that had \$1.04 in stamps on it was to be redeemable for \$1 in cash. The extra four cents were to go for administrative expenses.

More than a million voters endorsed the scheme, in the face of warnings by President Roosevelt and others that it would ruin the State if passed. Voters were warned that repeal of the sales tax would mean disaster to the public school system.

The beating did not dishearten the Ham-and-Eggs promoters who conducted an intensive membership campaign.

Objections Are Met

Then, with more than 300,000 members in the fold, each contributing 10 cents or more a week, the promoters rewrote their plan and started a drive to get it on the ballot at a special election.

In dressing up the scheme the promoters eliminated the clause repealing the sales tax and struck out the provision requiring public employees to accept half of their salaries in warrants. The votes of public employees were courted by a special clause under which their salaries would be automatically increased in the event the cost of living went up.

To attract the votes of small property owners, a paragraph was written in exempting from taxes all homes and farms with an assessed value of \$3000 or less. A three per cent gross income tax was authorized to offset the resultant loss of revenue, with incomes up to \$3000 a-year and all transactions on warrants exempted.

Provides for State Bank

Having stopped all these loopholes the promoters faced another hurdle. Bankers pointed out the scheme would fail because the banks would not be allowed to accept the warrants. So the promoters provided for a State bank, to be capitalized by a 20-million-dollar bond issue and an additional 50 million dollars through sale of stock to the public.

Under terms of the initiative an administrator of the pension plan, who would be chairman of the bank's directors, would be named. The administrator would have powers superior to those of the State's Governor, and his acts would not be subject to review by the courts.

A commission of three would be in charge of collecting approximately 500 million dollars more in new taxes which it is estimated the gross income tax would produce.

The draft complete, the promoters circulated petitions and in a month had more than 1,250,000 signatures.

TWO SUITS AGAINST DOWD TRANSFERRED

VALPARAISO, Ind., Oct. 12 (U. P.).—Two suits filed by T. Ernest Maholin, Indianapolis attorney, against Alfred Dowd, warden of the State Penitentiary at Michigan City, are on file in Porter Superior Court on a change of venue from La Porte County.

One suit asked damages of \$10,000 on a charge of libel. The second asked Mr. Dowd's impeachment.

Mr. Maholin is attorney for Earl Niverson, Alphonse Skusewich and Richard Sweet, prison convicts facing kidnapping charges in connection with an attempted escape last June.

He based the libel charge on a letter which Mr. Dowd allegedly wrote to Niverson's sister. The impeachment suit alleged that Mr. Dowd was cruel to the prisoners.
