

DRIVERS NOW IN MOST PERILOUS PERIOD OF YEAR

Capt. Johnson Urges Extra Caution During November And December.

Capt. Lewis Johnson, head of the Accident Prevention Bureau, today urged Indianapolis motorists to drive slower and more carefully during this month and December, "the two danger months of the year."

Capt. Johnson pointed out that earlier darkness, wet pavements and bad visibility are prevalent in these months, and that records of the past years show that accidents and traffic deaths increase during this period.

Two Killed Last Month
Last month two persons were killed by automobiles while six died in October last year.

Every Accident Recorded
This difference is not an actuality but a matter of recording, he explained.

Last year only the more serious accidents were recorded and this year every accident that comes to the attention of the police, no matter how slight, is permanently recorded, he said.

'SILENT' WITNESSES TESTIFY FOR G. M.

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Nov. 2 (U. P.).—The defense was expected to continue its parade of "silent" witnesses in Federal Court today at the trial of General Motors, G. M. A. C., two affiliated companies and 17 officials on charges of violating the Sherman Anti-Trust Act.

Yesterday 44 "silent" defense witnesses appeared, all General Motors dealers. They were permitted to tell only their name, address, business and how long they had been in business to the jury, and the rest of their testimony was solely for Judge Walter Lindley and the record.

They were allowed to testify for the record in the event of an appeal from the jury's decision. Judge Lindley sustained Government objections that their testimony was irrelevant.

The defense called William Nicholas of South Bend, a Pontiac dealer, in an effort to refute testimony given earlier for the Government by F. L. Mendez, also of South Bend.

EVANSVILLE AMNESIA VICTIM IS IDENTIFIED

EVANSVILLE, Ind., Nov. 2 (U. P.).—Early last month police found an amnesia victim and held him at a city hospital. Yesterday, still unable to identify him, they broadcast his description.

This led to his identification as David Uilery, 28, of near Evansville, and he was taken home.

Students enrolled in the civilian pilot training course at Butler are assisting with preparations for the show. Proceeds will be placed in a scholarship fund for the aviation course.
