

HAMILTON GETS HOOSIER SLANT ON COMING RACE

G. O. P. Victory in Indiana Is Indicated, National Chairman Says.

Republican National Chairman John D. M. Hamilton returned to the East today after consulting Indiana party leaders here on 1940 campaign strategies.

He said that if President Roosevelt becomes a third term candidate "it will be the dominating issue of the fall campaign."

En route back to Washington after a conference swing through the Middle West, Mr. Hamilton said party leaders of six states meeting recently in Topeka, Kas., reported that "Republican chances for a national victory this year are looking better than in 1938."

'Merely Getting Ideas'

He conferred here with Will G. Irwin, national committeeman from Indiana; Mrs. Grace Reynolds, national committeewoman; State Chairman Arch N. Bobbitt and State Vice Chairman Eleanor Snodgrass.

"I was merely getting ideas from Indiana party leaders on campaign plans and discussing subjects to come before the National Committee at Washington Feb. 16," he said.

The Chairman said the consensus of party leaders on the National Convention date is that it should be held after the Democratic convention "but not too late to jeopardize campaign machinery."

Cities that have sent in bids for the National Convention, he said, include Kansas City, Chicago, St. Louis, Minneapolis, San Francisco, Philadelphia and Atlantic City.

Discusses Factionalism

Mr. Hamilton said the National G. O. P. Program Committee, headed by Glenn Frank of Chicago, is expected to make an important report on issues at the National Committee session next month.

Discussing factionalism in the Republican party, Mr. Hamilton said "I am sure we don't have one-tenth as much factionalism as the Democrats are having right now."

He said the financial condition of the National Committee "is very good."

"We have wiped out a debt of \$1,267,000 and of that amount \$667,000 was paid from voluntary subscriptions, none of which was more than \$2000. They ranged down to as little as 15 cents."

He said the 1938 Republican gains in Indiana indicate a G. O. P. victory in this state next November.

POLICE REPORT 50 PAID TAIL-LIGHT FINE

Approximately 50 motorists paid fines last week during the attempt of the Safety Board to enforce the tail-light law, it was learned today.

A list of the motorists has been submitted to City Controller James E. Deery by Police Chief Michael Morrissey. Mr. Deery requested the list of names so that the fines can be refunded if the City Legal Department decides they were collected illegally.

Corporation counsel Edward H. Knight has been asked by the controller and the Safety Board to determine whether the attempt to enforce the law was valid. While this determination is being made enforcement will be held in abeyance.

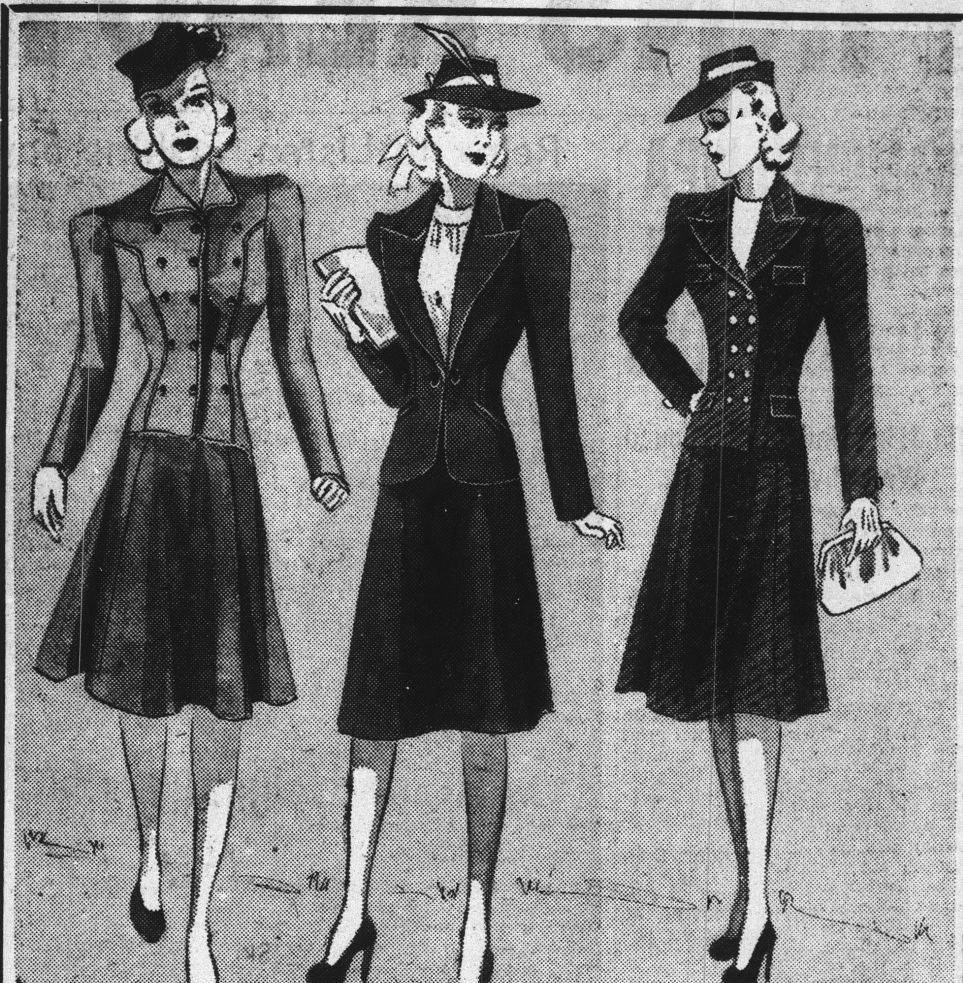

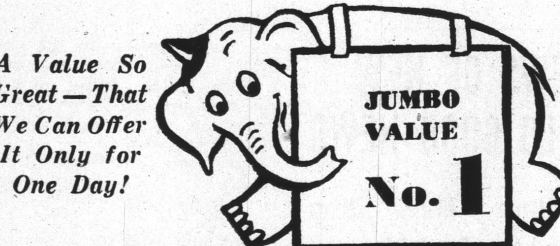

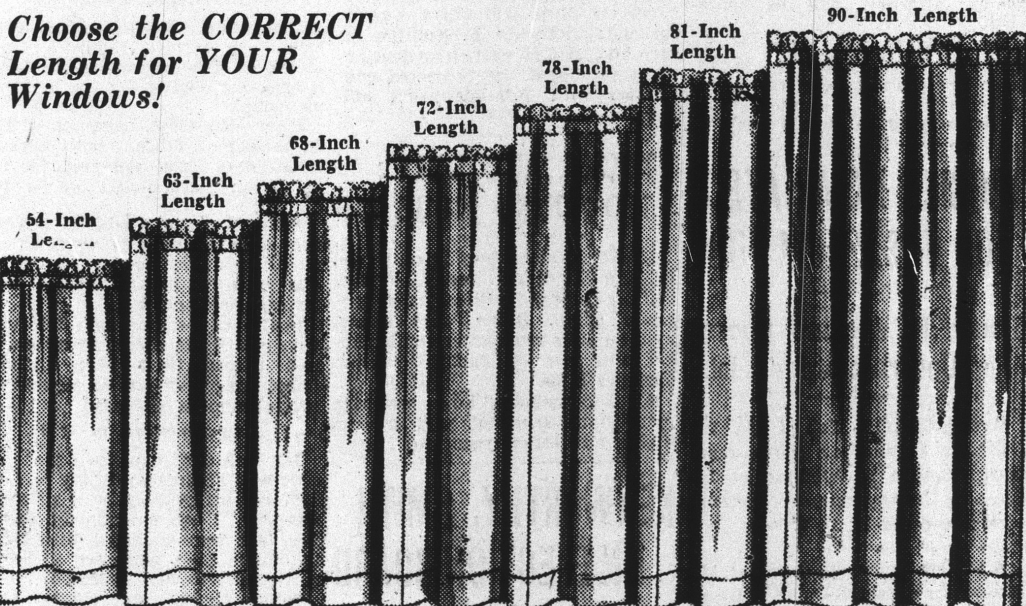
