

REVEALS NEITHER  
A 'PEACE' PARTY

Nazi Attempts to Pin 'War' Label on Democrats Failed, Concensus Shows; G. O. P. Effort to Take Credit Has Failed So Far.

PRINCETON, N. J., April 24.—Which party is more likely to keep the United States out of war, the Republicans or the Democrats?

When the Nazis released their recent white paper on alleged American machinations for war, many observers believed the purpose was to influence the public into thinking that the Democrats might lead the country into the war.

A national survey just completed by the American Institute shows that, if this were the purpose of the Nazi white paper, it had a negligible effect on public sentiment.

The survey finds that voters do not consider the Republican Party any more peace-minded than the Democratic Party. In fact, a slightly larger group of those polled think the Democrats are more likely to keep us out of war than the Republicans, while many say it makes no difference what party is in power.

The issue put before a cross-section of voters in the survey was as follows:

Which political party do you think is more likely to keep us out of war? The Republicans or the Democrats?

A poll was taken on the identical question last December, and trend is as follows:

Republicans More	51%	33%
Democrats More	27	35
Makes No Difference	32	32

An average of one voter in every six expressed no opinion on the issue in the recent survey.

The results are particularly interesting in view of the attempts of some G. O. P. leaders to establish the Republican Party as the "peace" party.

The survey indicates that Republican efforts to establish this argument have borne little fruit as yet.

While there has been a decline since December in the number of voters who say it makes no difference which party is in power, nevertheless neither of the major parties is singled out by the rest of the voters as being particularly war-minded.

SALES TOP AVERAGE

Automobile registrations during the last two weeks have averaged 4000 daily against a normal average of between 1200 and 1500, Frank E. Finney, State Motor Vehicle Bureau Director, announced today.

He reported auto license plate sales for the first quarter of this year of \$7,427,069.55 compared with \$7,098,679.20 for the first quarter of 1939.

The total income for the first quarter from license plates, title registration, transfers and drivers' licenses was \$8,058,737.70 compared with \$7,695,302.70 for the first quarter of last year.

The State also collected \$1,118,170.47 in weight taxes. No weight tax was collected the first quarter of 1939.

Mr. Finney left today for Des Moines, Iowa, to attend a two-day meeting of motor vehicle commissioners of 14 Midwestern States.

BY DEMOCRATS

Choices Subject to Change, County Machine Says; Weiss 'Left Out.'

Although complete accord has not been reached on the 11 State Representative nominations, the tentative slate includes the following:

Mrs. Roberta West Nicholson, David H. Badger, Mrs. Edna A. Bingham, Maurice T. Harrell, Jack B. Kamins, Charles W. Lahman, Menger M. Mance, Herman H. Propert, Robert M. Stith, Walter Truman and Judson West.

Party leaders said this list "undoubtedly" will be changed before primary day. They said Robert Allison and Edward C. Wakeman may be worked into the list. Nineteen other candidates who filed for nominations for representative will have little chance to get on the organization slate.

Party leaders have chosen William H. Larrabee of New Palestine for nomination as Congressman from the Eleventh District, over Russell J. Dean, Indianapolis attorney, and have slated Louis Ladow for renomination as Congressman from the Twelfth District over William C. Erbecker.

The slate listed Dr. John E. Wyettbach for the coroner nomination over Dr. Norman R. Booher and Dr. John A. Salb. This slate also may be changed in a few days, one party worker said.

John C. Ryan was slated for renomination for surveyor over Herbert Bloemker, former surveyor.

Prosecutor David M. Lewis is unopposed for renomination.

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HUTCHESON HITS  
BUSINESS HEADS

Charges 'Mass Cowardice'  
In 'Failure to Defend  
Enterprise.'

Executives of American business were charged with "mass cowardice" for "failing to defend enterprise with more than pious words" by William L. Hutcheson, president of the International Carpenters Union.

Mr. Hutcheson broadcast his address over the NBC red network at 9 p. m. yesterday with WIRE as a local outlet.

He said labor long has warned the nation that interference of government in free industrial enterprise would result undesirably, and that labor has long fought against shackles on business.

Attacks Business' Stand

Then he charged that American business leaders "failed to be leaders in the fight against bureaucratic control of industry" that they lacked effective action when the shackles were being laid on free enterprise; that they lacked effective organization to resist policies "which they knew were disastrous to the public and to labor."

"I charge them with spending millions of dollars to extol the merits of their products, and practically nothing to tell the public the needs and necessities of business."

Sale of beer in his restaurant at 5529 E. Washington St. was stopped and sale of package liquor from the Irvington Liquor Store, 5533 E. Washington St., on Sorrentino property, was halted.

Mr. Sorrentino and Fred Kline, operator of the package liquor store, went to Lebanon to appeal for a new trial of the case in Circuit Court. The injunction was handed down Saturday and recorded yesterday. It was based on original deed covenants which banned sale of intoxicating beverages on property controlled by him.

Meanwhile, three drug stores in the area affected by the covenants continued today to sell package liquor, not having been defendants in the action that was directed only at Mr. Sorrentino.

Neutrality and Preparedness  
Go Together, Kelly Writes

There is no inconsistency in the American Legion's demand for absolute neutrality and, at the same time, military and naval expansion. Raymond J. Kelly, Legion national commander, asserts in an article in the current issue of the magazine.

Executive action, and to keep our industrial set-up elastic to meet any situation that might arise."

Discussing the "home defenses" against the growth and spread of fascism and revolutionary movement and propaganda, Commander Kelly praised the work of the Dies Committee investigating committee.

"It is not a witch hunt, but it is a searching investigation into the ramifications of anti-American and un-American organizations and conspiracies."

"As a result of disclosures made by the Dies Committee, the Moscow-directed movements have been slowed up, but not stopped. There is much yet to be done."

Mr. Kelly said that the Legion hopes that before the Committee is finally dissolved, "the entire network of alien agents, conspirators and propagandists will be laid bare to public scorn."

That, tersely stated, is the message of the American Legion to the American people today."

Commenting that the Legion's insistence upon maintenance of neutrality long before the present war began, Mr. Kelly adds:

"But we are not idealists enough to think we can wish harm away from our country. While praying for peace and exerting every effort to shun war from us, our good sense tells us to hold our fully prepared armed forces in readiness for instant action."
