

## HOLD SERVICES FOR WAR DEAD

Three Groups Announce Memorial Programs for Today, Sunday.

Memorial services will be conducted at the Harrison and Lincoln statues in University Park at 7:30 o'clock tonight under auspices of the Daughters and Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War.

The U. S. W. V. drum corps will conduct the massing of the Colors. A short address will be given by William H. Ball.

Similar services were to be conducted at 2 p. m. today in the Grove of Remembrance, Garfield Park, by the Hamilton-Berry Chapter, Service Star Legion. Speakers were to include DeWitt S. Morgan, Indianapolis Schools superintendent, and Raymond Townsley, American Legion Indiana Department commander.

Memorial services will be conducted Sunday by the Oaklandon Service Post 124, American Legion, at three cemeteries.

The schedule includes: 2:30 p. m., Gravel Lawn Cemetery, Fortville; 3:15 p. m., I. O. O. F. Cemetery, McCordville; and 4 p. m., the I. O. O. F. Cemetery, Oaklandon.

The program includes: Master of ceremonies, Leigh J. Fischer; assembly, Bugler Martin Jordan; prayer, Chaplain J. F. Linder; Lincoln's Gettysburg address, Jesse Linder; floral tributes, Jesse Linder; decoration of graves, Glenn Downey; roll call of the dead; Cornelius B. ## 'Play Day' for Miners

Today was "play day" at the 13th annual convention of the Mine Inspectors' Institute of America, with the delegates from all coal mining states taking a bus trip to various Hoosier points of interest.

The trip was to include a visit to the Martinsville gold fish hatchery, then to Bloomington where Herman B. Wells, Indiana University president, was to speak; to Brown County State Park, and to the Masonic Widows and Orphans' Home in Franklin.

No coal mines were on the itinerary. The three-day convention will be closed with a business session tomorrow. Yesterday's program included addresses on the development of safety features in mines from Australia to Indiana. The association is headed by Thomas Allen, Denver, Colo., president, and C. A. McDowell, Pittsburgh, secretary. Fred Ferguson, director of the Indiana Bureau of Mines and Mining, was temporary chairman at yesterday's meeting.

## 2 QUESTIONED IN TAXICAB DEATH

Face Manslaughter Counts; Third Kentuckian Is Sought by Police.

JEFFERSONVILLE, Ind., May 28 (U. P.).—Two Kentuckians were questioned today by Clark County officials regarding the slaying of a 38-year-old Jeffersonville taxicab driver, Edmund Davis, whose battered body was found, bound with wire, Sunday.

They were J. W. Hayden Jr., 20, and Clementine Luttrell, 17, both of Daviess County, Kentucky. Officials said they were seeking Milton, 36, also of Kentucky, in connection with the case.

Both Clark County officials and State Police said there were no clues regarding Hawkins' whereabouts.

### Arrested in Owensboro

Hayden and Miss Luttrell were returned to Jeffersonville yesterday from Owensboro, Ky., for questioning. They were arrested at Owensboro after State Police and county officials had sent out a plea to all Midwest police to watch for them.

They were trapped when State Police pieced together a torn postal card bearing Hawkins' picture which was found in Davis' cab. Police traced Hawkins to Owensboro where they found Hayden and Miss Luttrell.

Hawkins, according to Sheriff Claude C. Conner of Clark County, recently was released from the Kentucky State Prison at Eddyville. No charges have been filed against him, although voluntary manslaughter charges were placed against Hayden and Miss Luttrell.

### Criticize State Police

Both Sheriff Conner and Prosecutor Homer D. Smith criticized Indiana State Police for lack of "cooperation" in connection with the case. Sheriff Conner charged that state officials concealed evidence which might have led to earlier arrest of persons involved in Davis' slaying and also might have led to earlier arrest of persons involved in Davis' slaying and also might have resulted in the earlier finding of his body.

Mr. Smith charged that State authorities released Miss Luttrell to Owensboro because although he held a warrant charging her as an accessory before the fact.
