

MOVE TO CURB CHECK FORGING

Fingerprint System Being Set Up by Commercial Associations.

A system whereby all strangers cashing checks will be required to place their right index fingerprint on the check before receiving cash at banks or other institutions is being established throughout Indiana, State Police Superintendent Don F. Stiver announced today.

Mr. Stiver said that through cooperation of the Indiana Bankers' Association and other commercial associations, the State Police Identification Bureau hopes to establish a separate fingerprint file of all known forgers in the state.

"By getting the fingerprint of all persons cashing checks who are unknown to cashiers, the identity of forgers and fraudulent check artists can be traced quickly through the State Police single fingerprint file," Mr. Stiver said.

Co-operating with the State Police besides the Bankers' Association are the State Chamber of Commerce, Associated Retailers of Indiana, Indiana Restaurant Association and many other retail groups.

RACE WELCOME PLAN COMPLETE

C. of C. Distributes 80,000 Pieces of Literature For Visitors.

The Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce has completed plans to extend a "real welcome" to the thousands of visitors arriving today and tomorrow for the annual 500-mile speed classic Thursday.

Through its Citizens Speedway Committee, the Chamber has enlisted the aid of private citizens in staging the annual race. About 80 thousand printed pieces of literature have been distributed to all parts of the city.

This literature consists of six thousand posters, bearing greetings and offers of information and assistance; 12 thousand badges and 20 thousand windshield stickers, and 4500 bulletins giving suggestions on how to use the literature and charts.

The literature has been distributed to 650 filling stations, 30 downtown garages and parking lots, 175 drug stores, Indianapolis Railway vehicles and city police and firemen.

NEW BEECH GROVE COURT FINES THREE

If the first conviction is a precedent, the offense of double parking is going to be considerably more costly in Beech Grove than in Indianapolis.

The first three cases handled by Magistrate Ira M. Helmes were, one for double parking and two for turning in the middle of a block.

The defendant in each case was fined \$5 and costs. Costs are \$1. Double parking in Indianapolis costs the offender a traffic sticker for which he must pay \$2. Turning in the middle of a block, if committed in Indianapolis, brings a fine at the discretion of the Municipal Court Judge.

Mr. Helmes is one of two magistrates appointed by Circuit Judge Earl R. Cox under the new Magistrate Act.
