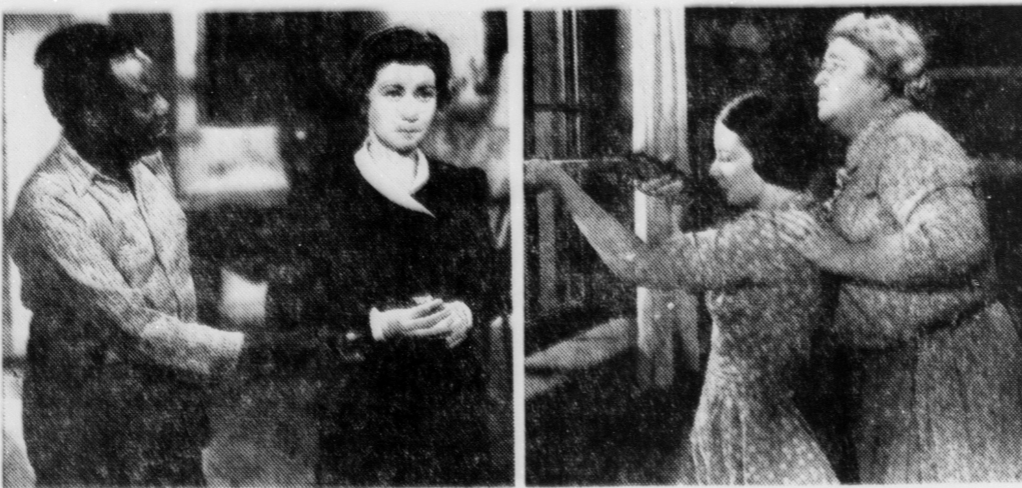
10 PICNICS PLANNED AT RIVERSIDE PARK

Stanford Grads Take to the Road

PALO ALTO, Cal., July 4 (U. P.).—A fresh effort and a new method for keeping drama alive in the United States has been launched here by the Roadrunners Productions, which will take the drama to the people by automobile and trailer.
The company is composed exclusively of graduates of Stanford University who have distinguished themselves in some phase of campus dramatics.
They have formed a co-operative stock company equipped to travel all over the country.
Their first tour will be limited to Nevada, Idaho, Utah and California, however.
The Roadrunners' safari will be managed in a rather swank fashion. They have a truck rebuilt to house a shower, washroom, bunks for the men members of the troupe, lockers for all the company, a fully equipped light booth and an observation car.
Girl members of the troupe will sleep in the trailer, which will also carry the sets, benches for 400 spectators, tents, props and furnishings. The trailer, in fact, is the theater.
