

# VOTERS APPROVE CALLING UP GUARD

All Classes, Parties, Sections Show Unity in Backing Bill For Year's Training: 'Must Be Prepared,' Say Most in Answers.

PRINCETON, N. J., Aug. 16.—The bill passed by the Senate and the House authorizing President Roosevelt to call the National Guard for one year's intensive training is approved by an overwhelming majority of American voters in a national survey.

In fact, the proportion favoring the measure is among the highest ever registered in an American Institute poll.

When voters in the cross-section survey were asked: "Do you think the National Guard should be called out for one year of military training?" the results were:

Favoring Calling Guard... 85%  
Opposed... 15%

Fewer than one person in every 10 (9 per cent) was undecided or without an opinion.

The vote is very much in line with national sentiment already expressed on the issue of conscription, and it furnishes additional evidence of the public's great desire for preparedness.

Institute polls have found the voters two to one (66 per cent) in favor of the principle back of the Burke-Wadsworth Bill—a peacetime draft of able-bodied young men. Every state in the Union voted for conscription in the Institute's last survey reported a week ago.

The calling of the National Guard, which would mean an addition of anywhere from 150,000 to 200,000 to the regular Army, finds no serious opposition in any of the major population groups.

By a vote of 82 per cent or more, it is approved in all geographical sections, in all age groups, and from top to bottom of the income scale. On few issues have the common people ever been so unified.



## JACKSON GETS WILLKIE OFFER

G. O. P. Repayment Urged if All 1936 Campaign Books Are Ruled Illegal.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16.—The battle of the campaign books moved into a new phase today with this challenge from Wendell L. Willkie, the Republican Presidential candidate, to Robert H. Jackson, the Democratic Attorney General of the United States.

If Mr. Jackson will say that both parties violated the Corrupt Practices Act in 1936, Mr. Willkie will promptly urge the Republican Party to repay money received for advertising in its convention book of that year.

Meanwhile, members of the committee of Cleveland citizens which published the 1936 Republican book insisted that it had not violated the law and was in no way a party actively, but was a local enterprise which raised a comparatively small sum toward the expense of entertaining the G. O. P. national convention.

Two Agree on One Point

Mr. Willkie had charged previously that the Democratic National Committee did violate the Corrupt Practices Act and should return more than \$525,000 received for advertising in its 1936 and 1940 campaign books.

On another point, Mr. Jackson has already agreed with Mr. Willkie—that the Hatch Act forbids sale of copies of the 1940 Democratic book, either by the Democratic National Committee or by state and local organizations.

The 1936 Republican book was sponsored by the Cleveland convention committee, a non-partisan group organized to bring the national convention to that city and entertaining it there. One member of that group said today that the total expense was about \$150,000, and that a small part of that was recovered from advertising receipts from the convention book.

Book Profitable in 1936

Thousands of copies of the 1936 Democratic book were sold by the Democratic National Committee, its receipts from such sales amounting to \$481,000 that year and to \$379,750 more in 1937, when de luxe copies containing President Roosevelt's autograph were sold to many corporations and individuals at \$250 each.

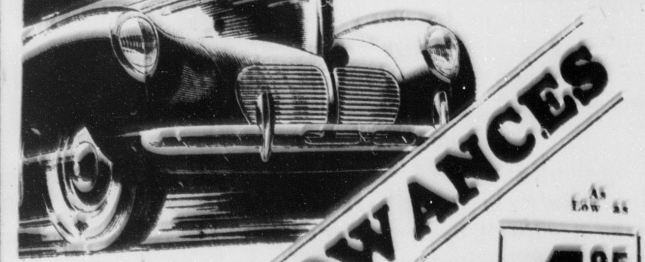
The Philadelphia citizens' committee which entered the G. O. P. national convention this year was forbidden by the Republican National Committee to publish a convention book.
