

BRANDED CATTLE
CONVICT RUSTLER

HEREFORD, Tex., Oct. 9 (U.P.)—Branded cattle traced from Deaf Smith County, Tex., to Cedar Rapids, Iowa, brought conviction to a rustler on the Panhandle Plains. J. M. Bussell was convicted of stealing nine head of cattle from Mrs. C. M. Brown, who lives near

Friona in Deaf Smith County. He was sentenced to two years in prison.

The cattle had been sold to an Iowa stockman at Lubbock, Tex., and were traced to the stockyards in Cedar Rapids through brands. Sheriff's officers and inspectors for the Texas and Southwestern Cattle Raisers Association, Inc., led the search through a dozen states.

billion years ago. University of Denver geologists decided after an extensive study of the rocks and formations in the Rocky Mountain region along the Continental Divide


PRISONER KEEPS TRADITION


