MOTOR CLUB AGAIN SEEKS TAG RELIEF

Stoops Says Club Will Ask Legislation Setting Purchase Date Jan. 1 and March 1; No Extension This Year.

When next Christmas comes around, the Hoosier Motor Club hopes to have "things fixed" so that there will be no skimping of holiday budgets to buy license plates for the family automobile.

Todd Stoops, secretary of the club, announced today that his organization would again introduce a bill before the coming session of the General Assembly to fix the time for purchasing license plates and drivers' licenses from Jan. 1 to March 1. Such a measure was introduced in 1939 but was "lost in the shuffle." Officials think they have a good chance of getting the measure passed this time, especially since enforcement of the present Dec. 31 deadline, as announced yesterday, will make people realize how troublesome it is to have to buy tags during December, they say.

Mr. Stoops had no comment to make on the ruling of Frank Finney, commissioner of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, that there would be no extension of the deadline this year.

Merely Follows Law

Mr. Finney explained that he was merely following the law. It was pointed out too that deadline extensions granted in previous years were unnecessary this year because of the favorable employment situation.

Some pressure is sure to be brought on Governor Townsend to get him to extend the deadline but it is believed that it will not be strong enough to cause him to change the deadline which was announced by Mr. Finney after a conference with the governor.

Officials of the Indianapolis Chamber of Commerce and the Indiana Farm Bureau say they have no interest at present in the situation. Farm Bureau officials say that their members can afford to buy licenses as well in December as in any other month of the year.

Touhy Loses Branch

The political axe fell yesterday, a week before the 1941 auto licenses go on sale, on Earl Touhy, manager of the highly-lucrative automobile license branch at Muncie and Democratic chairman of Delaware County.

He was replaced by Mrs. Ann Walterhouse, formerly a Democratic vice chairman of the county. No official would be quoted on the reason for Mr. Touhy's replacement but one State House Democrat explained that "the party carried Delaware County in spite of him." It is reported that Mrs. Walterhouse represents the labor group given chief credit for carrying the county for the Democrats.

Next week, the State Highway Commission will announce "how and where" it will spend around \$20,000,000 for road construction and improvement during 1941.

Chairman T. A. Dicus said that the plans for the 1941 program are complete and that nearly all of the projects scheduled have been checked carefully by commission officials.

But Important War Data Must Be Secret, British Press Chief Says.

LONDON, Nov. 29 (U. P.)—Cyril Radcliffe, chief of the press censorship, announced that all correspondents were free to write their opinions and that the complaints over censorship were due to the fact that "neither the press nor the public understands the range of information" which might be of use to the enemy.

As an example, he said, Germany, seeking evidence of the success of its night air raids, might gain military information from the announcement that a train has run late.

Enemy Seeks Information

No news dispatch is suppressed merely because of the opinion expressed in it, Radcliffe said. But, he said, in a total war, "little occurs in a country's daily life that the enemy does not long to know so that he may plan his strategy accordingly."

"Consider air raids," he continued. "Germany has been forced to attack mainly by night and such attacks involve intricate problems in navigation. The enemy aims at a particular town or objective. His pilots return and say the objectives have been damaged or destroyed. 'If we name a town from this country he knows if his navigation has been correct or to what extent inaccurate. If we give him any details of damage or lack of damage at any important point he knows whether to try again or turn elsewhere."




