

G. O. P. TO LINE UP LEGISLATIVE BILLS

Scores of Potential Laws Will Be Scanned by Steering Committees Next Week; What Will They Do to Schricker's Powers.

Scores of bills, many of which later become Indiana laws, will be given their first official recognition by legislative leaders here next week.

Republican Steering Committees of both the State Senate and the Lower House will convene in joint sessions, beginning Monday for three weeks of intensive study at headquarters in the Claypool Hotel.

Heading the committees, which will maneuver all bills of the Republican majority through the Legislature, will be Senator William E. Jenner, majority leader in the Senate and Frank T. Mills, of Campbellsburg, majority leader in the House.

Mr. Mills was Mr. Jenner's campaign manager when the latter sought the Republican Governor nomination last spring. When the two were selected as floor leaders, the control of both houses became vested in the forces that backed Mr. Jenner's candidacy.

Outlines Drafted

Meeting with the Steering Committees will be State Republican Chairman Arch N. Bobbitt, Speaker of the House James M. Knapp and Lieutenant Governor-elect Charles M. Dawson, who will be presiding officer of the senate.

Rough outlines of the more important bills were drafted this week during conferences of legislative leaders with district and county Republican chairmen.

The first bill being considered is one designed to repeal the Reorganization Act and set up a new structure of government control, taking away from Democratic Governor-elect Henry F. Schricker considerable patronage powers.

Conspicuous at legislative headquarters is a huge chart showing the detailed break-down of executive control in the State Government as it now is under the Reorganization Act. It shows the Governor in complete control of every division, even those of other elected officials.

It has been agreed that the Legislature will restore to all elected officials their former patronage powers.

Consider Other Changes

How much further the Republicans intend to go toward party control in the Government remains only conjecture now, but majority leaders have hinted that "other important changes are being considered."

Republican leaders contend privately that the party must take over "enough control of the government to carry out campaign pledges and restore home rule to the people."

Majority leaders are eyeing the lucrative Motor License Bureau, now under control of the Governor's office.

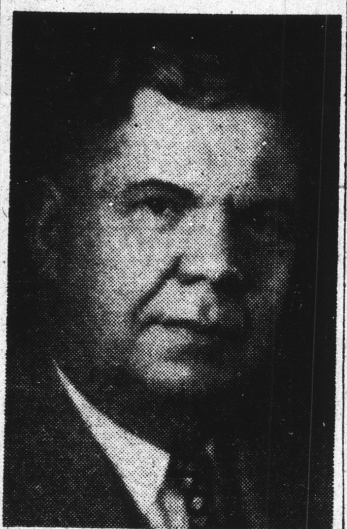
It is believed that department is certain to be taken over by the Republicans, probably as a subdivision of the Secretary of State's office or the Lieutenant Governor's office.

The Republicans, during the campaign, pledged to end the "beer racket" and the "highway rackets." In order to carry out those pledges, the G.O.P. majority would have to take control of them from Mr. Schricker or forfeit all credit for reforms accomplished.

KEEP PLEDGES, WILLIS URGES

Fulfillment by G. O. P. in State Will Bring '42 Victory, He Says.

HUNTINGTON, Ind., Nov. 29.—U. S. Senator-elect Raymond E. Willis said Republicans elected to State offices must carry out their campaign pledges to "rid the State of rackets and extravagance," in an address at a Republican victory dinner here last night.

"Only in the fulfillment of these pledges will we make a Republican victory in 1942 certain," he said.

"We charged that special interests were conducting various forms of rackets and that State institutions were being prostituted for private profit."

"These vicious practices must have no place in our Republican Administration. Our margin of victory in 1942 must be widened by proving to the people our worthiness to serve."

"While there are today 25 million voters in America whose daily lives are affected by some financial support from the Government, President Roosevelt received but one million votes more than he did in 1936," he continued. "When these potential threats against a free election are considered, our victory, in the face of nominal defeat, becomes impressive."

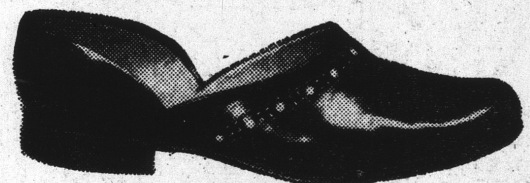

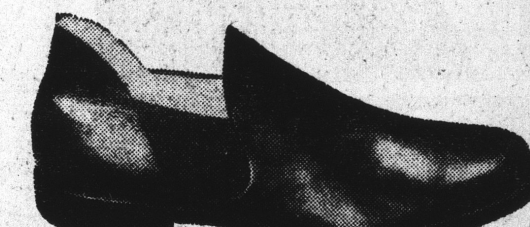
