The United Press reports jubilation in the ranks of Broadcast Music, Inc., in its dispute with the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers over the acquisition by the networks' music source of 15,000 titles from the Edward B. Marks Music Corp., one of the nation's major music publishers.

Mr. Marks is quoted as saying that he never received "proper consideration" from ASCAP and had leased his library for five years at an annual cost of \$250,000. The lease takes effect Jan. 1 when ASCAP's contract with the stations expires.

Gene Buck, ASCAP president, said he was not disturbed "a bit."

Mr. Marks has done little in recent years except build "a very wonderful foreign catalog," he added. But BMI officials said acquisition of the Marks library might mean the difference between success and failure of BMI's attempt to supplant ASCAP, which controls the bulk of music published during the last 50 years.

BMI reported that 6000 titles in the Marks catalog are being prepared for immediate use. Among them are some written by Jerome Kern, Irving Berlin, Lorenz Hart, Richard Rodgers and Sigmund Romberg before they teamed up with ASCAP.

Meanwhile the Federal Communications Commission has rejected a proposal that it attempt to mediate the controversy.

"The existing controversy between ASCAP and the radio broadcast in-

dustry has not been presented to the commission by any of the interested parties, and consequently no position has been taken in that regard," FCC Chairman James L. Fly has written E. F. Hummert, New York advertising man who suggested the mediation.

"It is accordingly suggested that any proposal for mediation should be made to the parties in interest."

However, it appeared that the right of the states to pass legislation designed to break ASCAP's music monopoly is to be determined by the U. S. Supreme Court.

In a decision yesterday the high court agreed to review a three-judge Federal Court decision holding such a statute in Nebraska unconstitutional.

The lower court found that the individual ASCAP members had turned over to the organization their rights under Federal copyright statutes to fix prices for the use of composition, control the terms of use and collect the money.

Mr. Buck challenged validity of this law and the special district court ruled in his favor on the ground that one section of the law infringed on the rights granted composers by the Federal copyright law.

Starting tomorrow a patriotic program is to be broadcast on the 11th of each month from hundreds of stations throughout the country under sponsorship of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Title of the series is to be "Speak Up for Democracy," according to Commander-in-Chief Joseph C. Menendez, New Orleans, who made the announcement.

Mr. Menendez is to be in Indianapolis tomorrow and will give one of the inaugural addresses over WIRE from noon to 12:15 p. m.

By Jan. 11 the V. F. W. hopes to have at least 500 stations taking part of the allotting time to local speakers.

## Willkie Gets Bid to Biennial Weepers' Party

REVERE, Mass., Dec. 10 (U. P.)—A special engraved invitation was sent to Wendell L. Willkie today inviting him to be present next week at the "Second Biennial Weepers' Party"—a get-together of defeated political candidates.

In an atmosphere of gloom the luckless candidates will try to cheer each other up, according to the sponsor, James I. Mede of Revere, who reported a huge success two years ago when he held a banquet after his defeat in the election for Revere councilman.

Mr. Mede still is eligible to sit at the head table—he lost the election again. The meeting was designed primarily for Revere politicians but any "bona fide politician who can show indisputable evidence of his defeat" can get in.

"Nothing can serve as a substitute for a good cry," Mr. Mede said. "And those attending can do so to their heart's content and receive the heart-felt consolation of defeated brethren."

Before sitting down to a turkey dinner, the candidates will be furnished large size handkerchiefs, blotters and sponges so nothing can interfere with their "enjoyment." The waiters will carry mops so the "tears won't damage the floor."

A flutist and trap drummer will play the theme song, Wagner's funeral march, and each guest will receive as a favor a miniature funeral casket to remind him of his "death at the hands of political assassins."

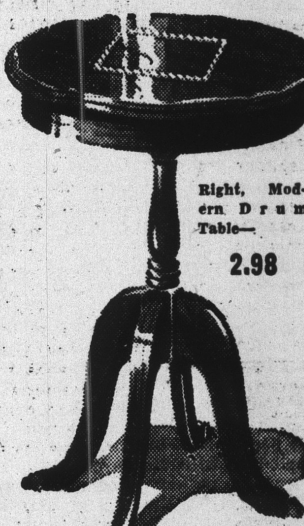

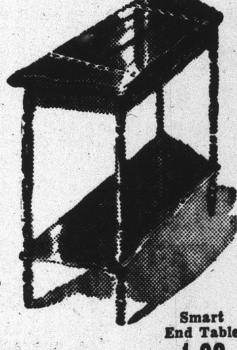

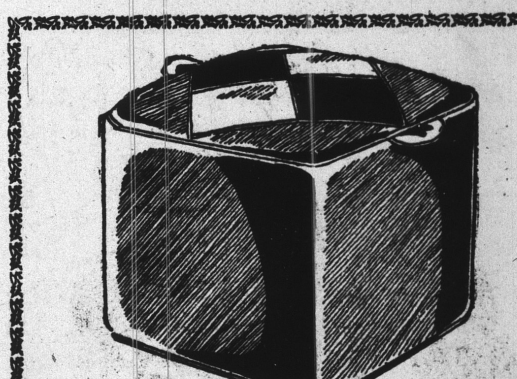
