

DRIVER WINS APPEAL ON TROLLEY CHARGE

An affidavit charging a 19-year-old girl with passing a streetcar was quashed in Criminal Court yesterday on the defendant's motion setting out that there was no statute covering the passing of a trackless trolley.

Judge Dewey E. Myers said he was helpless to do anything but uphold the motion, and reversed Judge John L. McNelis of Municipal Court 3 who had fined Dorothy White, 1215 Hoefgen St., \$50 and costs.

Miss White said she had not passed a streetcar, but a trackless trolley on Shelby St. Judge Myers said there should be both a state and city statute including trackless trolleys.

The present statute includes only streetcars, which are defined as "cars with wheels running on tracks."
