TOWNSEND TO LEAVE SUNDAY FOR CAPITAL
Governor Townsend will leave Sunday for Washington to discuss plans for designating Clarkstown, Ind., as a national defense area.

The Governor said that if the town were designated as a defense area, WPA funds could be spent on municipal improvements without a 25 per cent sponsor's contribution.

The town, which has more than 100,000 population, since construction began on the Government's \$1,000,000 powder plant there, is without funds and needs a new school, a fire department and an expanded sewage system.

It is reported in Washington that Governor Townsend also will confer with Chester C. Davis, head of the Agriculture Division of the National Defense Council, on taking a position as liaison man between labor and agriculture for the Council.

Governor Townsend has declined to comment on the reports except to say that he expects to talk to Mr. Davis.
