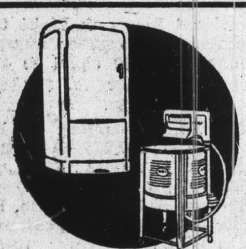

City Hall— OFFICIALS FEAR RISING INTEREST ON CITY BONDS

Rate Would Gain If Issues
Are Subject to Tax;
Need Paving Cash.

For about a year, the United States Conference of Mayors has been predicting dire results for cities if Congress should decide to tax municipal securities. Up until a few days ago, the literature, replete with illustrations and statistics found its way into the overloaded wastebasket in the office of Mayor Reginald J. Sullivan. Yesterday, however, City officials began worrying.

If the Government should tax these securities, officials wondered, what would happen to interest rates? City Controller James E. Deery said he didn't know and none of the previously ignored warnings of the U. S. Conference of Mayors could be found.

Interest Would Rise
It was a safe guess, officials concluded, that if tax free municipal bonds (referred to in the trade simply as "municipals") should lose their tax exempt status, interest rates would jump. And with them, the City rate.

In the last two years, Indianapolis has been able to sell its bonds for unparalleled low interest rates. Interest has fallen to between 1 1/2 to 2 per cent which has made the financing of expensive improvements comparatively cheap for the City.

Tax experts at City Hall now believe that these low interest rates—low because municipal bonds are tax exempt and hence considered profitable investments—would disappear if the bonds were taxed. Rocky Road Ahead
Interest rates would rise at least high enough to cover the amount of taxation on the bonds, probably higher the experts predicted. And the increase in rates of interest would be borne—in long run—by the taxpayers.

Looking ahead, officials see a rocky road to travel if this happens. There is track elevation, for instance, which would require financing by bond issues and other improvements as well. That's why they're worried.

'Shop' for Improvements
Works Board members are in the market for new street improvements. They have an estimated \$90,000 in gasoline tax funds available this year for streets. No more. Like the shopper hunting bargains, the Board is trying to figure out how to make the available money go to the most good. There have been numerous suggestions.

Board members yesterday considered the cost of paving S. Meridian St. from Maryland St. south to the Belt Railroad elevation. That section of the City's No. 1 thoroughfare is in bad shape, according to Engineer M. G. Johnson. Central Ave. Considered
Another paving possibility under consideration is Central Ave. from Ft. Wayne Ave. to 34th St. Work on that street has been delayed for some time. The Board's decision on the paving is contingent on the willingness of Indianapolis Railways Inc. to help out by either removing abandoned rails or sharing in the cost of paving over them.

In considering both improvements, Board members agreed the cost would be paid 75 per cent. The City would pay 25 per cent and the abutting property owners the rest.

JEHOVAH WITNESSES
APPEAL CONVICTION
LA PORTE, Ind., Jan. 9 (U. P.)—Ten members of the Jehovah Witnesses sect today sought an appeal to La Porte Circuit Court of verdicts against them in City Court.

They were charged with violation of the City's transient merchant ordinance after arrest, Dec. 31, while selling cult literature on downtown streets. Mayor Alfred Norris found them guilty, but suspended fines of \$1 and costs. At the time, two members defending the group argued that members were called to spread God's word and that man-made law should not interfere.

Keeps Lodge Books for 41 Years and Still Likes Job

There's something about keeping the books of his lodge that fascinates Charles E. Jones, and so for 41 years he's been secretary of Central Lodge, F. & A. M.

He is 75 and the lodge, often referred to as the keyhole of Indianapolis, is 117 years old. Mr. Jones, a retired printer of 36 years' experience, became a Mason in 1893 at Lafayette, Ind., where he was born.

He came to Indianapolis in 1900 and on Dec. 1 of that year he was elected to office. And there he's been since. When he joined, there were 200 members and the lodge met in the old Claypool Building that stood where the Roosevelt Building now stands at Illinois and Washington Sts. The organization now has about 1800 members, with rooms at the Masonic Temple, North and Illinois Sts.

Four years ago Mr. Jones got a chance to get a good typewriter at little cost, so now he writes all his records and reports on it. "It would vary, but I expect I handle about \$25,000 a year," he said. Name a Masonic body and chances are Mr. Jones, belongs. He's a member of them all except the Sahara Grotto.

5 TRAFFIC COURSES SCHEDULED UPSTATE

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Jan. 9.—Five regional training courses in "Traffic Enforcement and Public Safety" for law enforcement officers will be conducted in the northern part of the State starting Jan. 20.

J. L. Lingo, Purdue University public safety institute director, said the courses will continue with weekly sessions through the week of March 24.

The courses will be designed primarily for police officers, sheriffs, town marshals, prosecutors and others. The work will be under the direction of Mr. Lingo and Sgt. P. T. Beverford of the Indiana State Police.

Dates for the various schools include Mondays, West Lafayette; Tuesdays, Logansport; Wednesdays, Ft. Wayne; Thursdays, Goshen, Fridays, Valparaiso.

U. S. BLOOD HELPS THE BRITISH FIGHT

LONDON, Jan. 9 (U. P.)—American blood in the veins of Englishmen is helping them fight the battle of Britain, Dr. A. N. Drury, chairman of the blood transfusion committee of the Government Medical Research Council, said today. Dr. Drury said 56 wooden cases containing 20 quarts each had arrived here thus far and already had been distributed to towns, cities and villages of Scotland, Wales and rural England, where supplies are lowest, for use in treating cases of shock.
