

# How Hoosiers Voted On Year's Roll Calls

Senators Often Cast Like Ballots, Despite Politics;  
All Backed War Declaration.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2.—How the Hoosiers voted throughout 1941 is shown by the annual year-end compilations of outstanding roll calls in both the Senate and House.

Senator Frederick VanNuy (D. Ind.) and his freshman colleague, Senator Raymond E. Willis (R. Ind.), saw eye to eye on many New Deal proposals and voted alike, the record shows.

Both were against important Administration defense measures, such as the draft extension, as were all the Hoosiers in the Lower House except Rep. William H. Larrabee (D. Ind.).

## Split on Censorship

Here is the Senate record: Limit use of armed forces to the Western Hemisphere, VanNuy nay, Willis yea; no change in present law on armed forces, March 7, 1941, both yea; no censorship of press or radio, Willis yea, and VanNuy announced against; restrictions on transfer of naval craft, Willis yea, and VanNuy paired against; two billion loan vs. lend-lease plan, Willis yea, and VanNuy announced against; lend-lease passage, Willis nay, and VanNuy announced against; seven billion lend-lease appropriation both yea; boost parity appropriation to \$450,000,000 both yea; no transfer of Axis ships to Britain, VanNuy nay, and Willis yea; ship seizure bill passage, VanNuy yea, and Willis nay.

Condemn labor stoppages at defense plants, VanNuy yea, and Willis announced for; authority to seize struck defense plants, the same; extend President's devaluation powers, VanNuy yea, and Willis paired against; special detective force for Navy both nay; limit draftees service extension to 6 months, VanNuy nay, and Willis yea.

## Agree on Road Bill

Override so-called defense highway bill veto both yea; ten dollar monthly bonus for extended service, VanNuy yea, and Willis not recorded; eighteen-month draft extension, VanNuy nay, and Willis paired against; lower income tax exemption to \$750, VanNuy yea, and Willis not recorded.

Strike out \$5 auto use tax, VanNuy nay, and Willis not recorded; \$5,985,000,000 lend-lease appropriation, VanNuy yea, and Willis not recorded; keep belligerent port and combat zone bans both yea; repeal

entire Neutrality Act both nay; Neutrality Act revision passage both nay.

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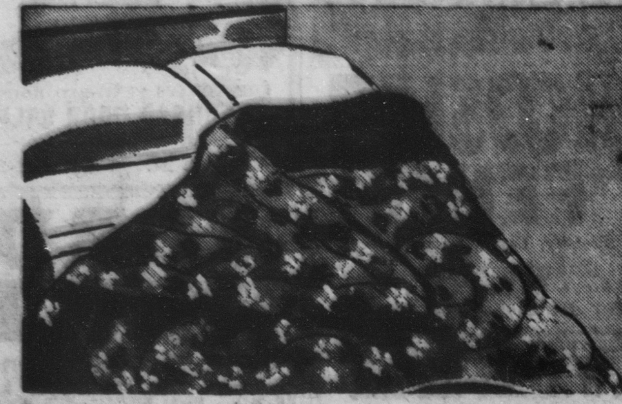


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
