Manila Defenders Write New Alamo Into U. S. History

 It took 100 years to produce the heroes of the Alamo and the men of Gen. George Custer's Army who fought the "good fight" against overwhelming odds.

The war with Japan is less than a month old, but out of it already has come the story of 378 heroic Marines who stood off the invader hordes from Wake Island for 14 days, and the defenders of Manila who today were writing another chapter of dauntless courage into American history.

Even while the guns and planes of the enemy rained death upon the defenders, Gen. Douglas MacArthur was able to speak of "international law" and "every consideration" to interned aliens, any of whom might be eager to stab him in the back.

The stamina and bravery of the new war's heroes were of the stuff that has made America great. They recalled, inevitably, the defenders of the Alamo and Custer's soldiers who could not be defeated.

None lived to tell the story of the Alamo, a walled mission in San Antonio, Tex. In 1836, during the war for Texas' independence, Col. William B. Travis, James Bowie and Davy Crockett and 180 men were besieged in it by Gen. Santa Anna and 4000 Mexicans.

The garrison held out from Feb. 23 to March 6 and killed some 500 Mexicans. On the 13th day, the Mexicans breached the walls and all but five defenders were slain in a hand-to-hand struggle in the chapel. The survivors were put to death by Santa Anna's order, but the cry, "Remember the Alamo," resounded until Texas was freed.

Custer's last stand was made at the foot of the Big Horn. Legionsport.

and Little Big Horn rivers in the Montana territory in 1876. Custer arrived with a regiment that was the advance guard of Gen. Terry's forces June 24; the main body was to join him two days later.

The presence of what was believed to be a small force of Indians was reported to Custer on the 25th. Dividing his regiment into three parties, he tried to surround them. But the enemy attacked in full force and when Gen. Terry arrived, Custer and the 264 men of his center column were dead, their guns in their hands.

CHURCHILL WEARS 22-YEAR-OLD MEDAL

WASHINGTON, Jan. 2 (U. P.).—The rosette which British Prime Minister Winston Churchill wears in his button hole these days is that of the U. S. Distinguished Service Medal awarded him 22 years ago, it was revealed today.

"He always wears it when visiting this country," said Sir Gerald Campbell, British director of information in the United States.

The medal was awarded to him in July, 1919, in recognition of his service as Minister of Munitions in the First World War.
