

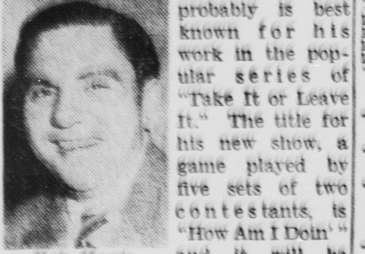

SPORTS: WIBC and 190 stations of the Mutual Broadcasting System will carry the Joe Louis-Buddy Baer heavyweight title bout tonight exclusively, beginning at 8 o'clock. Don Dunphy and Bill Corum will handle the blow-by-blow account from Madison Square Garden.

DEBUTS: Bob Hawk, veteran 34-year-old quizmaster and ad libber extraordinaire, tonight begins a new series of quiz shows, the idea for which he developed himself. In radio for 19 years, the genial quizmaster is best known for his work in the popular series of "Take It or Leave It."



The title for his new show, a game played by five sets of two contestants, is "How Am I Doing?" and it will be broadcast tonight on WFBM at 8:30 o'clock. . . . ## 1 DEAD, PATROLMAN HURT IN ACCIDENT

One person is dead and a motorcycle patrolman is seriously injured at City Hospital today as a result of traffic accidents in Indianapolis.

A Negro, unidentified, who worked at the Log Cabin tavern on Indiana Ave., was critically injured Wednesday when the car in which he was riding struck a utility pole and a parked automobile in the 1200 block on E. Michigan St. He died this morning at City Hospital. It was the second fatality in Indianapolis this year.

Motorcycle Patrolman John L. Furgason was riding east on Washington St. when he struck the rear of a tractor trailer at Harding St. Patrolman Furgason was thrown from his motorcycle. At City Hospital it was said he received a possible skull fracture.

The truck was driven by Walter Hillard, Charleston, Ill., who police said was turning into Harding St. when the accident happened. Police charged him with failure to use directional or hand signals. It was the officer's second accident within the last year.

## BABY DIES AS VIGO COUNTY HOME BURNS

TERRE HAUTE, Jan. 9 (U. P.).—A 6-month-old baby, Leland Darkis, was burned to death yesterday when fire destroyed the Darkis home in Vigo County near the Illinois state line. Three other children were led to safety by Mrs. Beulah Blair, a relative, who was burned seriously in her attempts to rescue the fourth child.
