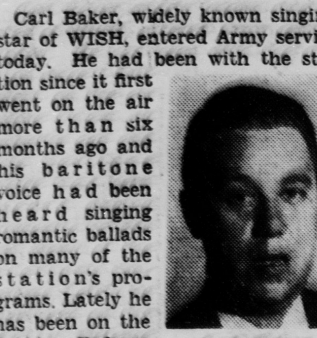


LOCAL RADIO PROGRAMS TONIGHT AND TOMORROW

26-BILLION ARMS BILL IS PUT AHEAD

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10 (U. P.).—Congress was ready today to expedite action on a new \$26,740,901,900 armament program which, it was believed, is designed to speed up and expand anti-aircraft gun and tank production.

Other multi-billion dollar appropriations have been passed in the last month to do the same things for the Army and Navy airplane programs and for warship construction.

The new bill, carrying \$22,883,901,900 for the Army and \$3,857,000,000 for the Maritime Commission's merchant fleet, was sent to
