Barbara Stanwyck Pulls Muscle in Right Leg.

HOLLYWOOD, Feb. 10 (U.P.)—Actress Barbara Stanwyck was crippled today with an ailment more common among athletes than film stars.

Kicking a newspaper photographer for a movie scene, she pulled a muscle in her right leg and developed a charley horse.

In real life, Miss Stanwyck wouldn't kick a camera out of a photographer's hand, but she had to in the movie. She stepped back and let go a kick which would do justice to a football player, then she winced.

It is, we believe, the first film on the defense workers.

Loretta Young is his actress-wife and she wants to retire to a life of domesticity. But he keeps on writing hits for her. And this, despite all that Robert Benchley can do, leads to Reno. But Mr. March's latest play, "Bedtime Story," gets her back. That's the title, too, of the movie.

Among the highlights of the film, which runs an hour and five minutes, are the Rainbow Division in action and an actual photograph of Capt. Eddie Rickenbacker shooting a German plane out of the skies.

Mr. Slack is showing the film as a private enterprise and will make a short speech from the stage before each showing. The pictures were loaned to him by the Intelligence with the stipulation that nothing be changed or distorted. They must be shown just as they were taken when Americans first sacrificed their lives to put down the German menace.
