Evansville Pays Less for Its Gas Than Any Other Large Indiana City

EVANSTVILLE HAS THE CHEAPEST GAS of any large city in the state, judging from typical bills sent to customers.

This is shown in a study by the Federal Power Commission of gas bills in the larger cities (50,000 population or more). Because natural, mixed and artificial gas has different heating values, prices were based on therms so the comparison would be a fair one.

Bills for 10 therms usually mean the customer uses gas for cooking only. Bills for 25 therms mean that gas is used for both cooking and water heating. Bills for 100 therms represent customers using gas for cooking, water heating, refrigeration and possibly heating the house. Here are the way Indiana cities rank:

MOST PORKERS GAIN 15 CENTS

Extreme Top Is \$12.95 as 6000 Hogs Arrive at Stockyards.

Most hogs sold 15 cents higher at the Indianapolis stock yards today than prices paid yesterday, the Agriculture Marketing Service reported.

The advance was made on weights over 100 pounds. Lighter weights were unchanged. The extreme early top was \$12.95 with some being held for \$13.

Receipts included 900 cattle, 500 calves, 6000 hogs and 500 sheep.

ODDS AND ENDS: We call it a sugar "shortage," but per capita consumption in U. S. this year will be about 77 pounds against an average of 31 pounds per capita in all countries of the world. . . . STUDEBAKER OUTPUT SOON WILL DOUBLE

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Feb. 11 (U. P.)—Officials of Studebaker Corp. predict that the corporation's dollar shipments will soon reach \$25,000,000 a month, probably within the year, which would increase its annual business volume to \$300,000,000, almost double Studebaker's 1938 peak shipment of \$157,000,000.

Officials said the increase will result mainly from production at Studebaker's new airplane engine plants—one at South Bend, Ft. Wayne and Chicago.
