SCHOOL UPSET OVER WAR TIME

200 Strike in Township Demanding City High Open Hour Later.

CLINTON, Ind., Feb. 13 (U.P.).—About 200 striking Clinton Township High School pupils today returned to their homes for the second day after learning that no arrangement had been made between city and township school officials to co-ordinate the time for the beginning of classes.

Clinton schools went on war time Monday and school still opens there at 8 a. m., while township officials advanced the starting time to 9 a. m. war time, in order to avoid the necessity of picking up many rural children before daylight.

Since the school buses operate on the township schedule, they are one hour late in delivering the high school pupils who must attend classes in Clinton.

Refuse to Stay Later

Clinton School Superintendent E. C. Boyd arranged for the township pupils to stay an hour longer in the afternoon to make up for the missed first period, but they refused yesterday and returned to their homes.

About 100 other township pupils are still attending school here and complying with the extra-hour ruling.

Mr. Boyd indicated he had not yet succeeded in making an arrangement with Township Trustee Dr. Odell Archer to get the striking pupils back to their classes.

It was reported Dr. Archer had offered to make a half hour compromise whereby school would start in both township and town schools at 8:30 a. m. war time, but so far, the Clinton Board of Education has made no move to comply.
