Symphony
Alters Plan

Saturdays and Sundays to
Be Concert Days.

If the financial hardships now facing the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra are overcome and there is a season next year, subscription concerts at the Murat will be played on Saturday nights and Sunday afternoons, Manager Franklin Miner announced today. In this and previous seasons, the pairs of concerts have been on Friday afternoons and Saturday nights.

"Under the current schedule," Mr. Miner said, "we found that teachers and other employed people were unable to get the seats they wished on Saturday nights."

"We hope the change will remedy this."

Mr. Miner also announced that the "pop" concerts would be held on week nights, rather than on Sundays as they are now.

Although next season's plans naturally are hindered by the uncertainty now confronting the orchestra, Mr. Miner said, the 1942-43 schedule calls for the regular number of concerts: 10 pairs of subscription programs, five "pop" concerts, two children's concerts and four public school appearances, plus the four dates.

Lotte Lehmann, the celebrated Wagnerian soprano, will be guest soloist with the orchestra at the next pair of subscription programs tomorrow afternoon and Saturday night.

Secretary of the Navy Knox has turned down a suggestion by Indianapolis Negro leaders that a navy unit be named in honor of Joe Louis.

The Indianapolis Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People submitted the request to him because of the "Brown Bomber's" large contribution to the navy relief fund.

Secretary Knox based his disapproval on the grounds that such honors are conferred only on deceased persons. The suggestion by the association was made through Rep. Louis L. Ludlow.

BATAVIA, Feb. 19 (U. P.).—Netherlands Indies authorities distributed 1800 war drums to natives throughout the Batavia area today to serve as emergency air raid alarms in event that expected Japanese bombs put electrical warning systems out of commission.

Each air raid precautions post was given a war drum on which to beat warnings to the people of the approach of enemy planes.

Defense forces over the entire island of Java, which includes Batavia, the capital, and the great naval and air forces base of Soerabaja, were put on the alert for a Japanese attack by seaborne or parachutist troops.

'Woman of the Year'
Is Packed With Laughs

Every so often, there comes along a movie comedy that hits just the right spot.

"Woman of the Year" now at Loew's is a film like that. It has that deft, human what-is-it approach that provides a laugh for all who see it. Briefly, it is a comedy that will make you rock and hold your sides and forget all the trouble that goes on practically every place nowadays except the theaters.

Maybe you remember "It Happened One Night," that Clark Gable film of 1934, which, for my money, is still the all-time tops for Hollywood comedy. Well, "Woman of the Year" has some of the rare touches the Gable movie had.

Spencer Has a Time

By comparison, the present comedy would come out a definite second, but there are scenes, in which Spencer Tracy and Katharine Hepburn are as funny as anything I remember.

For instance, there is the scene where Tracy bursts in on the stage where is Hepburn, the high-class woman think-maker, is making a speech. Tracy tries to paw his way out through the curtains which seem to have no opening. Frustrated there, he sits down in the speaker's chair. Unconsciously, he starts to light a cigarette and promptly spills his box of matches over the floor.

Katie Is Funny, Too

It goes on like that until I was squirming and bending and laughing all over three seats. I know it's bad for a "critique" to be doing that in public, but the crime has been committed.

After some time has been allotted for recovery from this one, there is the one where Katie starts to prove to hubby that she can be the handy little woman in the kitchen. The coffee bubbles over, the waffles go completely berserk and the toast jump out of the infernal machine almost to the ceiling.

"Woman of the Year" is not the greatest picture of all time (as this review might lead you to suspect), but it's funny and at times hilarious.

Mr. Tracy knows the value of under-playing comedy to give it the genuine touch. Miss Hepburn, does, too, and the minor roles, done by Fay Bainter and Reginald Owen, add to the mirth.

The story, which isn't terrific.
