
The climax of the convention will be attendance of delegates at the Indiana-Ohio State basketball game March 7.

Princess Irina Skariatina To Discuss Russian Spirit

Princess Irina Skariatina, born a Russian princess and heiress to the fabulous luxury of the imperial Russian court but who is now an American citizen, will speak at the Wm. H. Block co. auditorium at 2 p. m. Thursday.



An author of several books on her life in Russia and how she escaped execution during the revolution, Princess Skariatina also is well known as a lecturer.

She will lecture here Thursday on "The Fighting Spirit of Russia," answer questions and autograph her new book, "Tamara," a story of old Russia. Her other books include "A World Can End," "A World Begins," "Little Era in Old Russia" and "First to Go Back."
