## FDR BACK AT DESK AFTER TRIP TO N. Y.

WASHINGTON, March 31 (U. P.).—President Roosevelt was back at his desk in the White House today after a week-end at his home in Hyde Park and in New York City, where he spent three hours Monday afternoon at the former home of his late mother, Mrs. James Roosevelt.

With Mr. Roosevelt when he returned to Washington late last night were Rear Admiral Rosset, McIntire, his personal physician,

and Harry L. Hopkins. Both joined him in New York.

No newspapermen accompanied Mr. Roosevelt on his trip, a departure from pre-war practice.

While in New York, it was explained, the chief executive worked on settlement of his mother's estate. Mrs. Roosevelt died last year.
