Southworth Cracks Down and Concedes Nothing to Brooklyn

NEW YORK, May 22.—Shouldering the blame for Cardinals' weak start in the National league pennant race, Billy Southworth, dynamic little St. Louis pilot, left town vowing that his ball club would do something tangible about Brooklyn's big lead.

"I came to my senses at the Polo Grounds last Sunday after the Giants beat us in the first game of a double-header," Southworth said last night before departing for St. Louis. "I had been too soft, sympathetic and tender with my ball club. I decided to crack down on myself and everybody else."

"I did and you've seen a change in this ball club. We aren't at our best yet, but we are getting better every day. We spotted the Giants a four-run lead in that second game Sunday and came on to win. We haven't lost since and have run off four in a row. We are going after those Dodgers with hammer and tongs."

Southworth, biting off his words and banging his fist, told of one of the Cards' regular pitchers taking a 15-minute workout and returning to the clubhouse to get his arm rubbed.

Cards Mean Business

"From now on there'll be no more of that," he said. "No ball player leaves the field without permission from me. I'm not asking them to do anything I won't and don't do. I am kicking myself good and I expect to prod any player who isn't putting out everything he's got. That goes from the time the Cardinals come on the ball field. We had a sloppy infield workout in Boston. And, boy, did I stop that. I want those players hustling and making their plays and throws just like they were in a ball game."

Southworth didn't mention it but one Cardinal regular paid \$200 fine within the last few weeks. Yes, sirs, the Cardinals mean business with a capital B.

"Concede the pennant to Brooklyn—hell no!" Southworth yelled. "If I was ready to give up now I'd quit baseball for keeps. You are going to see the Cardinals right up there and don't you forget it. The Dodgers think so too. I guess, because they didn't want any part of us in the get-away game. The field was in condition to play but they called the game off. We were rarin' to get at 'em in their own back yard."

All eastern National league games were cancelled yesterday except the Reds-Phils game in which Philadelphia beat McKeechnie's club, 3-2, and knocked the Rhinelanders down to sixth place. St. Johnson bested Paul Derringer in a pitchers' duel. Etten's single and Litwiler's triple decided the game.

Bonham's Fourth Shutout

Ernie Bonham, rapidly establishing himself as the American league's premier pitcher, pitched the Yankees a 1-0 triumph over the White Sox. It was his sixth straight victory and his fourth shutout. He allowed only three hits, two of which were bunts. After the fourth only one Chicagoan reached first and Bonham retired the last 12 men in order. Edgar Smith, who allowed nine hits, walked the winning tally home.

With Ted Williams hitting his ninth homer with a mate on base, the Red Sox beat the Indians, 8-3, snapping the Tribe's four-game winning streak. Cleveland has yet to beat Boston.

Phil Marchildon allowed only six hits, winning his sixth game as the Athletics beat the Tigers, 11-3.
