And Tuesday will be a big day for it will mark four years on Miss Daniels' path toward the ministry. Miss Daniels already has work to her credit at the Pittsburgh Xenia Theological seminary, but has two more years before graduation from the institution.

At first she thought she wanted to be an evangelist, but now she is to fill some pulpit in the United Presbyterian church.

At 24, Miss Daniels has been blind since she was 8, but for the last four years she has had the services of her faithful companion and guide, "Gilly."

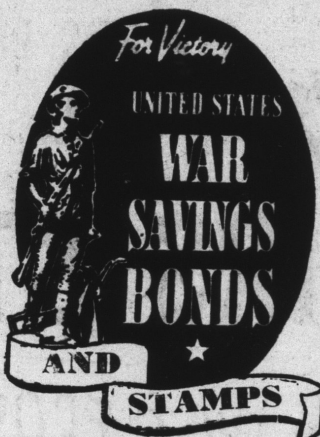
Miss Lewis will speak the valedictory and Mr. Shramm, the benediction.

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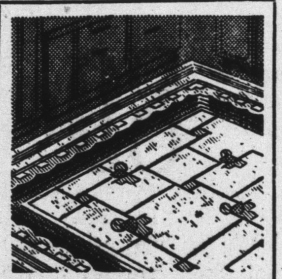
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
