

**SENATOR SLAPS
ALL RATIONING**

"One-Man Revolt" Started
With 'Cotton Ed' Smith
Defending Ruffles.

WASHINGTON, June 2 (U. P.)— Senator Ellison D. (Cotton Ed) Smith (D. S. C.) today classified himself as a "conscientious objector" to all wartime rationing, whether of gasoline or trouser cuffs.

"Why, they even tell me that now they're taking the ruffles off ladies' lingerie," Mr. Smith said. "Now who in the hell expects to win a war that way?"

He announced his one-man revolt after a study of the gasoline, rubber, trouser cuff and ruffle shortages. "All these rationing orders are nothing in the world but Chinese puzzles," he said.

"They've got the people so restless that they don't know what to do."

"Rationing of rubber and gasoline is the most horrible and irritating thing ever invented, and the American people just aren't going to stand for it, and I don't blame them."

"One of these days the American people will rise up and tell the government just what they are going to do. They are going to say: 'We're willing to fight a war, but we aren't going to fight one right here, so now you get rid of all those rationing orders.'

Blames Inefficiency

When a reporter asked whether ship sinkings along the Atlantic and Gulf coasts were not responsible for some of the shortages producing the rationing orders, Mr. Smith exploded:

"We ought to be kicked for being so inefficient."

Mr. Smith, who recently informed a Senate committee that the initials WPB stand for "we pass the buck," proposed this solution:

"We ought to take back every bit of the power congress has delegated to these rascals in all these agencies."

"Them Days is Gone"

"What we're doing is just letting every branch of the government except the executive branch go to hell. The time used to be when congress passed the laws, the executive branch carried them out, and the judiciary decided if they were constitutional."

"But them days is gone forever. Now we haven't got but one branch, and the others are just puppets."

"This nation has a right to be led by men who believe in the right things instead of men who are so all-fired concerned about what is going to happen to their business after the war."
