

WARNS INDIA ON FREEDOM AIMS

England to Fight Claims Now, but Pledges Self Rule Later.

LONDON, July 30 (U. P.).—Great Britain warned militant Indian nationalists today that it would take all means to meet anti-British activity in pursuance of immediate independence aims.

L. S. Amery, secretary of state for India, told the house of commons:

"The government can not but solemnly warn all those who stand behind the policy adumbrated by the working committee of the all-India congress that the government of India will not flinch from its duty to take every possible step to meet the situation."

The working committee, the executive of the nationalist congress, demands freedom for India now as the price of its full co-operation with the empire war effort against Japan.

As he gave his warning, Amery repeated that Great Britain would make good its pledge to give India the fullest opportunity to attain self-government.

HINT NAZI DIET AT 1918 LEVELS

Report Mothers Turning to Vitamin Pills to Ward Off Diseases.

LONDON, July 30.—On the basis of information available here, experts believe that the average German diet is approaching 1918 levels while mothers are turning eagerly to "vitamin pills" and other means to ward off children's diseases, especially rickets.

Forty per cent of the Reich's entire population is now eating on levels below those required to maintain health and efficiency, according to these sources which estimate the daily average of calories at less than 1800.

Dietitians say that 2000 calories are required to maintain efficiency and 2500 to maintain health over a long period.

Deficiency in iron, calcium and vitamin A is increasing the incidence of anemia, dental decay and skin diseases, according to the reports.

Shortages Certain Before Summer Ends In Golf Balls, Fish Hooks, Horseshoes

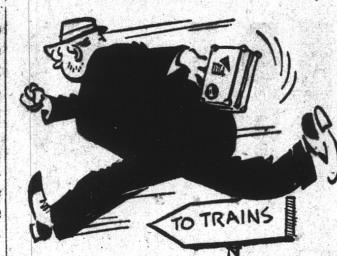

WASHINGTON, July 30.—Unless the golf ball industry thinks up something new, recovering of old balls will soon have to stop. Balata, the substance used to coat the balls, is needed for the more vital plane and shoe industries. . . . No new pitching horseshoes will be made, and the return of Dobbin has made every available shoe more precious than gold.

Don't let the fish get away with the hook—only one-eighth of the usual number of fish hooks may be produced this year. . . . And treasure that tough, slender line. Parachute cords are only one of many military uses for the special fibres used in fishing lines. . . . Nickel and aluminum for spoons, spinners and lures are cut off, too, as well as metal for reels and cork for floats.

EXPECT a clear cut answer soon to the question of whether widespread conversion of oil burners to coal should be made. Experts are studying effects of large-scale industrial conversion to coal, progress of pipeline construction, amount of iron available for making new coal grates. Meanwhile, the old-fashioned Franklin stove is coming into its own. Many closed fireplace flues will be opened to help ease home heating problems.

REVERSING last year's campaign, Americans are urged to buy and eat as much cheese as they can. Stepped-up production has outstripped even huge lend-lease

demands. . . . Watch for soups to appear in somewhat different form on grocery shelves. Larger cans with more concentrated contents will gradually replace the old types. The new soups will be clearly marked and will sell under slightly higher ceilings than those canned before June 30, 1942.

MAKERS of ceramics have developed a way to use hard burned clay, plain or glazed, for stove tops, sinks, tubs—and even acid tanks. With all sorts of metal kitchenware priority-struck, pottery utensils will soon be invading kitchens, too.

STOP ORDERS on manufacture of all pianos and other instruments may have made better care of old ones imperative, but if you've got an old, out-of-tune model sitting around unused, contribute it to the salvation campaign. One piano contains about 160 lbs. cast iron, 40 lbs. steel, 5.5 lbs. copper wire plus lots of brass, felt and rubber.
