WALLIS ISLAND, Central Pacific, Sept. 18. (Via Airmail)—Here's a place which enjoys two Sundays a week instead of one, and that means six church services for everyone instead of three!

It happened like this. Wallis is practically on top of the international dateline. It also has a number of garrisons widely spread on the island and only two navy chaplains to provide services. One is a

protestant, Lt. Ralph Robinson of Baltimore; the other is a Catholic, Lt. John Larkin, formerly of Our Lady of Carmel, Philadelphia.

It was Larkin's idea to bend the

international dateline a bit so as to make Sunday twice as long as it is anywhere else. Thus he can say six masses instead of three, getting around to all groups on

Wallis each week. This island has just been transferred, with U. S. blessing, from Vichy to DeQuallist hands. It is predominantly Catholic and has al-

ways had a more or less theocratic government due to the activity of French Catholic missionaries.

To the historically minded, Lt. Larkin's dateline idea recalls a Japanese dodge carried out when Nippon was trying, after world war I, to get control of phosphate rich

Nauru, one of the Gilbert islands.
