"My colleagues in the Royal Air Force and I consider ourselves very lucky to have had the privilege of coming to America and meeting all you swell people, and I hope I have the opportunity to return in full all the grand hospitality I received."

Church was killed in September, shortly after he returned to England.

"Though that seems a long time ago, I still think he would have liked you to know how much he appreciated the kindness and hospitality shown the R. A. F. in North America," Mrs. Dorothy L. Church, his mother, wrote in a letter accompanying her son's message.

She said an American lad was rescued at the time of the crash, and that although she knew "he did his best to save my son, it was not to be."

"So we add our thanks to his for all that everyone did to help these boys, and we know that everything possible is being done in England to help the American lads," she wrote.
