## RAF Pilot Wished to Thank Red Cross, but Death Came

The R. A. F. pilot was grateful to the American Red Cross for his cigarettes, but he will not have the opportunity he hoped for to say so in person.

In place of that is a simple message addressed to The Times: Ernie Pyle cigarette fund, found by his mother in his personal effects after he was killed. She forwarded it from London.

R. L. Church said he had received the carton of cigarettes "through the courtesy of that magnificent organization, the American Red Cross, on completing my training in North America."

"My colleagues in the Royal Air Force and I consider ourselves very lucky to have had the privilege of coming to America and meeting all you swell people, and I hope I have the opportunity to return in full all the grand hospitality I received."

Church was killed in September, shortly after he returned to England.
