

BURTON RITES ARE TOMORROW

Vaudeville Artist, Stage Producer in Business Here 27 Years.

Funeral services for Courtland D. Burton, vaudeville artist and producer and booking agent, will be at 2 p.m. tomorrow in the Montgomery funeral home, 1624 N. Meridian st. Burial will be in Crown Hill.

Mr. Burton, who embarked upon his theatrical career more than 45 years ago, died yesterday in his home, 2729 College ave.

For 17 years he and his wife, Mrs. Irene Mayer Burton, toured the United States and Canada in a musical comedy act. He wrote the book, words and music for one of his shows and contributed special numbers to others. In 1917 he began to operate the Burton theatrical offices in Indianapolis and was in his 17th year of business when he died.

He was a member of the Eagles lodge in Peoria, Ill., and the Benevolent Protective Order of Elks and Loyal Order of Moose here.

Besides Mrs. Burton his brother, Henry K. Burton, survives.
