Maj. G. H. Poske Pays Back Japs

MAJ. GEORGE H. POSKE, marine fighter pilot, settled a personal grudge against the Japs when he shot down his first Jap Zero over Rabaul, New Britain.

Son of George H. Poske Sr., 616 E. 34th st., Maj. Poske was in the air the first time since shrapnel from an enemy anti-aircraft battery broke his right ankle a few weeks ago.

The 27-year-old Leatherneck pilot was a member of a flight of marine fighters escorting army

B-24s to the big Jap base at Rabaul.

"I maneuvered to get on the tail of a Zero and opened fire at 300 yards before he saw me," Maj. Poske said. "As the tracers slid into the Zero, the Jap started a half roll. He was about one-quarter of the way around when the plane burst into flames and nosed straight for the ocean. It was a wonderful feeling. The other Corsairs chased the rest of the Zeros away."

SANTA ANITA TO GET 2000 NAZI CAPTIVES

LOS ANGELES, March 9 (U. P.). Approximately 2000 German prisoners of war will be moved into Camp Santa Anita "some time this summer," Brig. G. B. W. Simpson, commanding officer of the army ordnance training center, announced today.

Gen. Simpson said the Nazis will repair non-combatant administrative vehicles and reclaim clothing.
