BRITISH HANG GERMAN SPY

Attempt to Report Damage From Air Raids Is Thwarted.

LONDON, March 16 (U. P.).—Oswald John Job, 58-year-old British-born German who turned Nazi spy to get out of internment but failed to achieve his mission, was hanged today at Pentonville prison—the 14th enemy agent executed in Britain since the war began.

He admitted his treachery after police, who detained him when he arrived from Portugal last November, found secret writing materials concealed in a set of hollow keys.

Job was the fourth British subject put to death as a spy. The others included four Germans, three Dutch, two Belgians and one Swiss.

Born in London

A home office announcement said Job's object had been to report bomb damage and public morale, but he never had a chance to check on either.

Born in London in 1885 of German parents, he had lived in Paris from 1911 until France was overrun by the Germans, who interned him at St. Denis. There the gestapo offered to release him if he would go to England as a spy.

Under the plan, he was to write letters to British internees at Saint Denis in the names of their relatives and friends. Invisible ink taken from the key hollows was to have been used for part of the letters, which would be intercepted by the German secret police. He also carried a code arrangement for receiving instructions from the gestapo.

Escaped Internment

Arriving here by airplane from Lisbon, Job told an elaborate story about escaping from internment. Questioned by British authorities, he finally admitted that he was conducted to the French-Spanish border by gestapo agents.

At his closed trial, Job contended that he accepted the German offer merely as a means of getting out of France and that he had no intention of actually spying here. But a criminal court jury convicted him of espionage and a higher court denied his appeal on Feb. 28.

Johannes F. Winter, a Belgian who also posed as a refugee, had been the last spy executed in Britain. He was hanged at Pentonville Jan. 26, 1943.

GIVE UP HIT-RUN THEORY IN DEATH

Believe Bert Edwards Was Victim of Fall; Had Fractured Skull.

The coroner's office today abandoned a theory that Bert R. Edwards, 49, of 15 S. Sherman drive, an accountant in the state gross income tax division, who died Monday, was the victim of a hit-and-run car.

An autopsy yesterday showed that death was due to a fractured skull probably received in one of several recent falls.

The hit-and-run theory had been advanced because last Thursday an unidentified man assisted him home, said that he had "found him at the corner," and left. The autopsy, Coroner Roy B. Storms said, did not reveal any body injuries which would indicate being struck by a car.

Investigators learned that two days before he was brought home, Mr. Edwards had fallen against the furnace at his home and injured his head and that he had had other recent falls.

Mr. Edwards was treated at home until Saturday when he was taken to the Veterans' hospital. Funeral services were held today with burial in Crown Hill.
