

KERENSKY WILL SPEAK SUNDAY

Ex-Premier of Russia Here For Lecture in War Memorial.

"Russia and the International Situation" will be the subject of a lecture by Alexander Kerensky, premier of the Russian provisional government in 1917, at 3 p. m. Sunday in the World War Memorial.

The former premier, who escaped from the Nazi advance in Czechoslovakia and France, will speak on the Catholic Forum series.

Mr. Kerensky was premier of Russia for three and one-half years as successor to the czar. He was credited with releasing 2000 political prisoners, including Stalin, from exile. His government was overthrown by Bolsheviks.

The lecturer has written several books, including "The Russian Revolution" and "The Crucifixion of Liberty."

Morgan Collins of P. R. Mallory & Co. will preside at the lecture.


St. Benno Plans Annual Festival
