SYNTHETIC RUBBER AIDS PRICE CONTROL

ST. LOUIS, March 23 (U. P.).—The United States has achieved independence in rubber production and for the first time can "talk back to British and Dutch interests on price," it was declared in an interview yesterday by William M. Jeffers, railroad magnate and former U. S. rubber czar.

"We are in excellent bargaining position," Jeffers said. "We no longer have to pay prices set by foreign ministers. We set the prices ourselves."

While admitting tire manufacturing had so far been unsuccessful, he predicted they would eventually be able to make a heavy duty tire of synthetic rubber which would "stand up." He pointed out 40 years were required to produce such a tire of crude rubber.

'Miracle of Morgan's Creek' Clicks at Indiana.

With triplets, quadruplets and quintuplets being born in various corners of the world in the past few weeks, we might have expected Hollywood script writers to go one better and dream up a case of sextuplets, but you'll get chuckles, giggles and even belly-laughs from the Paramount film.

Sure enough, they came through in "Miracle of Morgan's Creek," a rollicking, sometimes slapstick comedy, which opened at the Indiana theater yesterday.

The plot is preposterous; the characters daffy; the dialog riotous, and the miracle the birth of sextuplets, but you'll get chuckles, giggles and even belly-laughs from the Paramount film.

The fun starts when Trudy Kockenlock (Betty Hutton) goes to a dance with some soldiers, returns home the next morning in a daze. She finally recalls she got married, but to whom she doesn't remember.
