Textile Shortage Still Acute, New Survey Starts

WASHINGTON, March 23.—There are signs that the textile shortage is such that an all-out attack on the problem will be necessary. The war production board has announced that in spite of all efforts to speed production of sturdy fabrics, there seems to be little hope that civilians will get a comfortable supply of work clothes. Military demands for these fabrics, used for dungarees and fatigue clothes is high.

The office of civilian requirements has launched another survey to determine the existing supply of clothing, yard goods, household linens, and miscellaneous household articles. The American Home Economics Association has been asked by Donald Nelson, head of WPB, to send out its scouts again to check the quality of goods now on the market.

These surveys will measure results of action taken since the last consumer survey. If results show civilian supplies still inadequate, you will see more stringent controls of textiles to cut down nonessentials and to spur production of needed household fabrics of dependable quality.

If you shop for a new Easter outfit, or gift, remember that any type of tie-in sale is verboten. The famous Order L-85, issued by the war production board two years ago, specifically prohibited the sale, at one unit price, of dresses with jackets, boleros, capes, coats or redingotes. But nothing in the order prohibited selling them at separate prices.

However, an office of price administration regulation does forbid "tie-in" sales. That means you don't have to buy a matching print jacket, scarf, or hood, which goes with the dress you buy, but which is priced separately.

The regulation states further that to get the stockings you want, you can't be forced to buy any other article, service, package, or wrapper. In other words, you can't be forced to buy a cardboard Easter egg package for your gift stockings, if you feel you want the stockings but can do without the egg.

More and better bedsprings are coming from a WPB grant of more steel for their manufacture. In order to distribute the few remaining new autos to users who need them, dealers will get special gas rations for delivering autos any distance. Previously gasoline was granted for no more than a 200-mile delivery.

RATION CALENDAR

MEAT—Red stamps A8, B8, C8, D8, E8 and F8 in Book 4 good for 10 points each through May 20. G8, H8 and J8 become good Sunday and expire June 18.

CANNED GOODS—Blue stamps A8, B8, C8, D8 and E8 in Book 4 good for 10 points each through May 20. Stamps F8, G8, H8, J8 and K8 become good April 1 and expire June 20.

SUGAR—Stamp 20 in Book 4 is good indefinitely for 5 pounds. Stamp 40 in Book 4 good for 5 pounds of canning sugar. Stamp 21 in Book 4 becomes valid for 5 pounds April 1.

SHOES—Stamp 18 in Book 1 expires April 30. No. 1 "airplane" stamp in Book 3 good indefinitely. Another shoe stamp becomes valid May 1.

GASOLINE—Stamp A-11 is good for 3 gallons through June 21. B-1 and C-1 good now for 2 gallons each; B-2, C-2, B-3 and C-3 good for 5 gallons until further notice. T good for 5 gallons; E-1 good for 1 gallon; R-1 good for 5 gallons. A, B, C and D coupons are not valid until they have been indorsed in ink with automobile registration number and state. Motorists should write both 1944 and 1942 numbers on book and on coupons.

FUEL OIL—Period 4 and 5 coupons valid through Sept. 30. All changemaking coupons and reserve coupons are now good. Consumers should have used not more than 84 per cent of their rations as of March 18.

TIRES—Next inspection due, A's by March 31, B's on or before June 30 and C's by May 31; commercial vehicles, every six months or every 5000 miles, whichever is first.
