'Cry Havoc'
Is Realistic

Loew's Film Tells a Story of
Bataan.

The story of the women on Ba-
taan, "Cry Havoc," now being shown
at Loew's theater, brings home
another of the phases of war.
Margaret Sullivan, Ann Sothern
and Joan Blondell, with a female
supporting cast, have the leading
roles as nurses during the destruc-
tion of Bataan. Miss Sullivan, as
Lt. Smith, has command of the
volunteer women who help the
wounded. These women worked
night and day to relieve suffering
with little or no medical supplies
or food.

"Take It or Break"
Living together under constant
fire of the Japs and the sound of
their own anti-aircraft, the women
either took it or broke down. The
hospital was bombed consistently,
food became more and more scarce,
and there was one last chance for
them to leave the island and per-
haps escape to Australia.
The picture is almost devoid of
plot with the exception of the love
story involving Margaret Sullivan
and Ann Sothern—with the man
that's never seen. The title is ex-
ceptionally fitting according to its
meaning as destruction, pillage and
the gathering of spoils.
The movie is completely havoc;
there is not one restful moment for
the movie goer. The war in its
grimmiest form of reality is well
portrayed by the cast—women are
also the heroes of war.
The associate production is "The
Heat's On" featuring Mae West,
Victor Moore and Xavier Cugat.

SURVEY SHOWS LIVING
COSTS HOLD STEADY
NEW YORK, April 7 (U. P.).—
The cost of living in March re-
mained the same as in February,
according to a survey announced to-
day by the national industrial con-
ference board.
The board's index stood at 103.4
in March as in February, compared
with 103.9 in January and 103 in
March, 1943. Food declined 0.4 per
cent and fuel and light 0.7 per cent,
while clothing rose 0.1 per cent and
sundries 0.8 per cent.
