





Churches, Theaters Here
Hold Special Services
On Crucifixion.

plaza of the World War Memorial.

One of the most popular and picturesque scenes of Good Friday services is the landmark, the more-than-a-century-old Christ Episcopal church on the circle. During the three hours, from noon until 3 p.m., in services based on the seven last words of Christ, the rector, the Rev. E. Ainger Powell is expected to address a packed church, with people crowding the vestibule and the sidewalk.

Hordes of business people were to take time out from work to join the changing congregations for services in the English theater and the First Baptist church which are sponsored by an interdenominational committee at Keith's theater, under the auspices of Missouri synod lutherans; at the Wheeler mission; and for united or individual services in every quarter of the city and in Marion county. The earliest services of the day were in the Episcopal churches, and the Catholic churches where the mass of the pre-Sanctified was held.

"Note of Hope"

While the atmosphere of all these services was necessarily solemn, underneath all the sorrow and lamentation, was the sustaining note of hope, "the last best hope of earth." For it will be recalled that Christ triumphed over death and gave to a believing world this promise:

"But if the spirit of Him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwelleth in you, He that raised up Christ Jesus from the dead shall give life also to your mortal bodies through His Spirit that dwelleth in you." Romans 8:11.
