GOVERNOR SCHRICKER has called off his scheduled trip to Washington for the dinner to be given there May 15 by Alex M. Campbell, northern Indiana district attorney.

While the governor's explanation was that he had "too many things to do at home to be running around over the country," his friends said that he didn't like the political implication that was being placed upon the dinner.

Some enthusiastic Democratic friends of his viewed the dinner as a "coming out" party to introduce to Washington officialdom as a prospective vice presidential candidate the only Democratic governor in the Midwest.

The governor has promptly put his foot on all attempts to launch a vice presidential boom in his behalf and he has left no doubt in the minds of his associates that he cannot be talked into even becoming interested in seeking the vice presidency.

The governor has not been in Washington since the 1941 inaugural. He has turned down repeated requests, some coming directly from the White House, to visit the President. He explained always that he had too much to do here.

Most pressing of the problems now confronting him is the selection of a successor to George M. Bernard, Republican member of the public service commission, who is due to go on the interstate commerce commission.
