Tokyo Broadcasts While Yanks Hit 2 Hours' Flying Time Away.

clear whether this referred to ground, naval or air action.

On Tuesday enemy carrier-based planes that came over Iwo Jima island were repulsed and so far 18 planes have been lost over this island," the broadcast said. "Chichijima was air-raided Tuesday morning, and on Tuesday afternoon it was subjected to shelling from enemy cruisers and destroyers.

"On July 3 Japanese fighter and ground units on Omiya Jima (Guam) intercepted an enemy formation of ship-based planes and downed 20 and repulsed the others."

• Gestures of Friendship

A broadcast said 23 planes attacked Yap island in the western Carolines Wednesday, and that six were shot down.

A Japanese communiqué also acknowledged that "powerful" American forces, supported by tanks, planes and war ships, steadily were penetrating the Japanese positions on Saipan. It spoke of "confused fighting here and there."

The board of information mingled propaganda gestures of friendship to the Chongking government along with its "special announcement."

The board said that its military operations in China were not aimed "at the Chongking regime."

U. S. marines, driving up the west coast of Saipan, captured Garapan, capital of the Marianas and the first Japanese city to fall to the Americans in the Pacific.

Bombard Bonin, Volcano

Vice Adm. Marc A. Mitscher's task force bombed the Bonin and Volcano Islands in Japan's inner defenses Monday, following an air attack Sunday.

American airmen downed 38 Japanese planes and probably 16 as well as destroying 24 on the ground in the Sunday attack.

Adm. Chester W. Nimitz announced three Japanese vessels were sunk or beached, a large cargo ship and a medium oiler sunk, and a destroyer left burning in Monday's fury.

Several small cargo vessels, also were damaged while 25 planes were shot down. The carrier force lost nine planes in the two days of action, but the warships were undamaged.

**NORMAN DAVIS RITES BEING HELD TODAY**

ALEXANDRIA, Va., July 5 (U.P.)—Scores of friends and associates of the late Norman H. Davis gathered here today for the funeral of the American Red Cross chairman, whose death Sunday terminated a distinguished career of diplomatic and social service to his country.

Six national vice chairmen of the Red Cross were selected as pall-bearers for services in Christ Episcopal church, of which Mr. Davis was a vestryman. The Rev. Alexandria C. Zabriskie, dean of Virginia Episcopal theological seminary, was to conduct the last rites.

Mr. Davis was appointed to head the Red Cross in 1938 by President Roosevelt who led the nation in mourning the death of the national chairman who had served in diplomatic posts under three presidents. Funeral was to be private.

**HONOR GOVERNOR AT GARFIELD PICNIC**

State employees will honor Governor Schriener with a picnic at Garfield Park, Aug. 30, in honor of his 61st birthday.
