## Bright Touch Provided by Gay Summer Perennials

The rock garden is a brilliant display of bloom in early spring and then fades out and shows green and gray the remainder of the year. The brilliant dwarf phlox starts us off in a blaze of glory and the dwarf iris with crocus, narcissus and dwarf tulips, followed by alyssum, candy-tuft, English daisy, saxifrage, violets and sedums usually complete our list of flowers.

There are so many lovely summer flowering perennials and annuals available that it seems a pity that we do not use them. A few groups planted here and there among the brilliant spring flowers will do much to brighten the summer garden.

Many members of the bell flower family can be used to rescue us and none is better than campanula carpatica, the Carpathian bell flower. Its large blue and white flowers bloom throughout June, July and August and are satisfied in any sort of soil.

The blue bells of Scotland, campanula rotundifolia, bloom throughout the summer. A variety of Olympia, a white form, flowers continuously through late summer.

Dwarf campanula, called garzania, is about five inches high

and is studded with blue flowers and a white eye. The mate to this is muralis, another dwarf variety whose violet flowers bloom all summer. Remember to plant these varieties where they are shaded during the heat of the day.

Two very pretty and trailing plants are mentha requienii, with white blooms, and nierembergia rivularis, also white. Both these plants stand the sun, but prefer a light shade part of the day. Mentha is of the mint family and gives a pleasing fragrance, so plant it along the rock garden path.

The late flowering pink, dianthus alpinus allwoodii, is one of the loveliest of all. Its large flowers of various shades of rose and pink add color to the garden in July and August. The only yellow species of garden pink answers to the name of Knappl.

Other attractive plants are the dwarf Genus which give us almost four months of blooms and grow as easily as the larger varieties.

## RATIONING DATES

**MEAT**—Red stamps A8 through 28 in Book 4 good indefinitely for 10 points each.

**CANNED GOODS**—Blue stamps A8 through 28 and A5 in Book 4 good indefinitely for 10 points each.

**SUGAR**—Stamps 30, 31 and 32 in Book 4 are good indefinitely for 5 pounds. Stamp 40 in Book 4 good for 5 pounds of canning sugar.

Applicants applying for canning sugar should send in one spare stamp 37, attached to the application for each applicant.

**GASOLINE**—Stamp A-12 is good for 3 gallons and expires Sept. 21. B3 and C3 and B4 and C4 good for 5 gallons. T good for 5 gallons through Sept. 30. E and E1 good for 1 gallon; R and R1 not valid at filling stations but consumer may exchange R for E at his local board if he wishes to purchase non-highway gasoline at filling station. A, B, C, D and T coupons are not valid until they have been indorsed in ink or pencil with automobile registration number and state. Motorists

should write 1944 numbers on book and coupons.

**FUEL OIL**—Period 4 and 5 coupons valid through Sept. 30. All changemaking coupons and reserve coupons are now good. Fuel oil rations for 1944-45 heating season now being issued. Period 1 good immediately.

**TIRES**—Inspection on passenger automobiles discontinued. Commercial vehicle tire inspection every six months or every 5000 miles. Inspection certificates still will be a requisite in obtaining replacement tires. B card holders are now eligible for grade 1 tires if they can prove extreme necessity. All A holders are eligible for grade 3 tires, including factory seconds, if they find tires which may be purchased.

**SHOES**—No. 1 and No. 2 "air-plane" stamps in Book 3 good indefinitely.
