### United Christian Group Names Rev. Taylor.

In the current World War, the United Christian Missionary society announces the appointment of five new staff workers—three in the division of Christian education and two in the division of home missions.

The Rev. George Oliver Taylor, already known among Disciples of Christ for his leadership in their youth program, has been elected executive secretary of the youth department of Christian education. He succeeds the Rev. Owen M. Kellison. To the same division, the society has named Mrs. C. T. Harness, who has been state representative for missionary organizations' education in Virginia since 1939. Mrs. Harness will fill the office of national director of adult and children's work in the department of missionary organizations.

### Miss Ely Named

Miss Lois Anna Ely has been called to the missionary education department as director of adult work. Miss Ely is a former missionary to China and frequent contributor to World War.

The two new workers appointed to the staff of the division of home missions are the Rev. Edwin L. Becker, Nebraska pastor, and the Rev. J. B. Hunter, who has been in charge of social welfare and religious and educational activities for war relocation work in the vicinity of Rohwer, Ark.

The Rev. Mr. Hunter is a former missionary to Japan who attempted to aid Japanese Christians in their effort to prevent the present war. He will direct peace and international relations activities as an associate of Dr. James A. Crain in the department of social welfare of the division.

## Dr. Faubion Here Sunday

Former Anderson Pastor to Give First Sermon.

The Rev. Wayne Faubion, former Anderson minister, will preach his first sermon as pastor of the Second Free Methodist church tomorrow morning.

The Rev. Faubion organized a Free Methodist church in Anderson, where only a mission of the denomination had existed. He is 31, an alumnus of Greenville College, Greenville, Ill., married and the father of two children. The Faubion family will live in the recently purchased parsonage of the church at 1028 S. Pershing ave.

The predecessor of the new pastor is the Rev. R. W. Green, who has served the limit of five years permitted by the denomination and is being transferred to Danville, Ill. Under the ministry of the Rev. Mr. Green, the congregation has remodeled the church in addition to buying the minister's home. Other religious events follow:

knowledge gained by travel in the holy land and from study of the original Hebrew text of the Old Testament provide source material for many of Dr. Zorn's sermons. These have won him fame over the nation.

The most brilliant social occasion is said to be of little interest to him. But if one of his "flock" falls ill or suffers bereavement, Dr. Zorn is all eagerness to be at his side. The comforting words which pour from him then, described as inspired, are held in remembrance by the membership.

Mrs. Zorn died in 1937. She is recalled as "the gracious, diplomatic minister's wife" who presided over his home, was of inestimable value in the church and still found time to be the mother of eight children.

During his administration of St. Paul's church, a new school and recreation building has been erected at the cost of about \$90,000. Dr. Zorn presided over St. Paul's centennial celebration in 1942, when 100,000 people in the United States carried on an inspection of the India mission in 1930.
