

GERMAN MUTINY FOUND IN ITALY

Some Troops Desert While
Others Defy Orders and
Seek to Escape.

GENEVA, Sept. 6.—With the Germans in northern Italy threatened both on the Gothic line, between Pisa and Rimini, and on their new Alpine front, many defections are reported from among their ranks.

At Plaisance, a German detachment ordered to assist in cleaning-up operations in Emilia province, refused to proceed, it is learned. At Sant'Antonio Brava, wehrmacht troops have gone over to the Maquis with arms and equipment. Many other units, completely demoralized, have endeavored to flee abroad.

At the same time the wehrmacht is proceeding with significant evacuations. Trucks laden with various merchandise, furniture, weapons, cattle and even disassembled bicycles are being moved to Germany over all northward routes, particularly via Emilia.


