## 'Mad Man of Mattoon' and 'Gardenia' Gas Mystify Police

**MATTOON, Ill., Sept. 7 (U. P.).**—The "Mad Man of Mattoon," a phantom prowler who has terrified residents of this city where he has anesthetized more than a dozen persons in their beds, remained as much of a mystery to police today as the "gardenia" gas he uses to overcome his victims.

No further attacks were reported last night and apparently the phantom has retreated to his laboratory where he manufactures the mysterious gas which leaves his victims partially paralyzed and ill, police said.

Police theorized that the man may be a crank who believes he has something against the residents of the city, a berserk scientist, who is testing a weird gas, or a fanatical high school chemistry student. He could be a sex maniac trying to victimize women by paralyzing them with an anesthetic, police

added, but this is hardly possible since he has made no attempt to molest any of his victims. Robbery also has been ruled out as a motive because the skullcapped figure never has taken anything from the homes into which he has sprayed the gas.
