SIMPLE SPRAY CURBS DISEASE

Antiseptic Vapor Used in Crowd to Control Small Epidemic.

CHICAGO, Sept. 7 (U. P.).—An invisible, antiseptic vapor which can be sprayed in homes, offices, factories and theaters to curb the spread of airborne infections ranging from the common cold to influenza has been developed at the Northwestern university technological institute, two scientists announced yesterday.

In experimenting with 2000 service men, Burgess Jennings, chairman of the department of mechanical engineering, and Dr. Edward Biggs, associate in medicine, found that rooms sprayed with the vapor brought a small epidemic of mumps under control and prevented spreading by air of hemolytic streptococci and colds.

They believe the spray will curb other airborne diseases, such as measles, scarlet fever, pneumonia, rheumatic fever, catarrhal fever, acute tonsillitis, chicken pox and acute sinusitis.

The vapor, made from triethylene glycol, is odorless, non-inflammable and inexpensive, and its presence in the air cannot be detected, except by scientific tests, the scientists said.

Converted from a liquid into a specially constructed vaporizer, it is distributed uniformly through the air by a duct and fan system.

DR. GEORGE TAYLOR TO EXPLAIN PARLEY

Dr. George Oliver Taylor will explain the purpose of the coming of the National Mission to Christian Teachers, Oct. 29 to 31, at a public meeting tomorrow at 7:45 p. m. in the Central Christian church.

Dr. Taylor is general secretary of the board of education of the United Christian Missionary society. He has served as Christian education director in churches in Kansas and Texas and was area director of religious education for the Disciples of Christ in the Chesapeake area with headquarters

at Richmond, Va. He has also been in charge of young people's and student work in the religious education department of the United society.

The mission to Christian teachers which Dr. Taylor will describe is an inter-church undertaking for Christian education and evangelism throughout central Indiana. One of its chief aims is to increase the enrollments in Sunday schools. Dr. Taylor is sponsored here by the general committees of the National Mission to Christian Teachers of which C. Oliver Holmes is chairman. It will be sponsored also by the church laymen's committee of the church federation whose chairman is G. V. Carrier.

PEACE PROSPECTS DELAY FUND GOAL

New developments in the European war relief situation and the possibility of an early cessation of hostilities have delayed announcement of the United War and Community fund campaign goal, directors disclosed today. The announcement of the goal and the annual appeal were scheduled next month.

Harold B. Sharp, fund president, explained that immediately following a collapse of Germany relief conditions and problems are sure to be obscure and confused. "It is anticipated there will be pressure for increases in relief budgets," he said.

He pointed out that 22 national committees providing relief for occupied countries, some of which now have been liberated, have been supported by the contributions of Marion county citizens. He also disclosed needs for China and the Philippines are expected to rise sharply with continued advances in the Pacific.

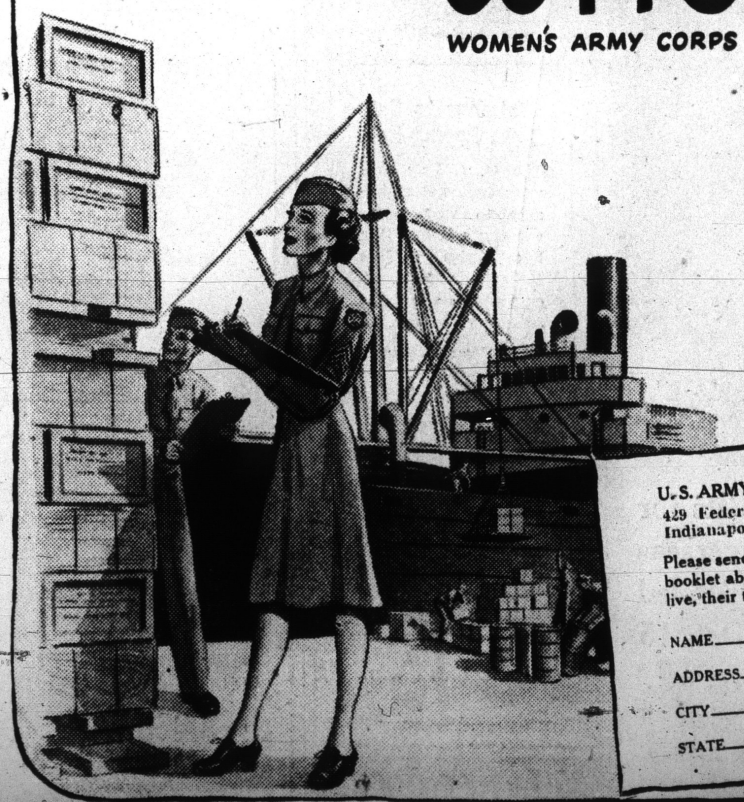
