Monkeys on Keith's Bill

Can a monkey talk? That, says Dod Dodson, was the challenging question that intrigued him so persistently as a pre-medical student in Southern California. Yesterday, eight years later—but this time backstage at Keith's theater—he was still interrogating himself along that same line.

Dodson is convinced that when a monkey gives you that shrill, piping chatter he's expressing an opinion on one thing or another. "Trouble is," he moans, "I can't get my monkeys to speak English... They understand a lot of English words all right. But whatever it is they speak—it isn't English."

Not Japanese Either

Dodson said no, he didn't think the stuff was Japanese either, though he had to admit there was a similarity there.

His simian braintrust, composed of five rhesus monkeys and a sad-faced baboon, rates top billing on Keith's vaudeville presentation this week.

How did this medico get side-tracked into the show business? Dodson explains he spent considerable time, experimenting with monkeys as a sort of biological hobby, finally coming around to the point where he lectured on their traits and so on in southern California.

And That Is How

"I was pretty wrapped up in the subject," he reminisced. Then, bing, he "got stuck." And obviously when you "get stuck" with a bunch of monkeys in southern California, well, you enter show business.

Also on the stage at Keith's are the Three Samuels, pantomime dancers; Juggler Lou Foulds; the Royal Whirlwinds, skaters; and the Frances Victory dancers, and Joe and Joey Mack, acrobats. Film fare is "The Racket Man."
